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WRECK ON THE U. P.

A West Bound Passenger Train Struck a Broken Rail

CARS DETACHED AND TURNED OVER

OGDEN, Utah, Nov. 11.—The Union Pacific passenger, westbound No. 2, from Denver, struck a broken rail here today. The train left, two cars and one engine were turned over in the ditch. Fifteen passengers were hurt, but none seriously.
