Growing Peaches—Want to Mar-
ry.

COUNCIL BLUFFS, Iowa,
February 12, 1876.

Editor Deseret News:

Knowing that our people are
alive to the necessity of creating
industries, not only for the supply
of home comforts, but that they
desire to become exporters of
these articles which can be produc-
ed at the least expense, I wish to
call the attention of our "Wells
at home" to a branch of in-
dustry that is within the reach
of nearly every household in the
Territory, that only requires a
very small portion of land, for in-
stance, one city lot and no more.

We have demonstrated that the
peach can be profitably raised in
nearly every part of the Territory;
coming quickly into bearing and
yielding an abundant supply,
but from some cause or other
our people have neglected, to a
great extent, for a few years past,
the cultivation of the valuable and
economical fruit.

Considerable attention to the cul-
tivation of the apple, which in Salt
Lake City has been a serious fail-
ure for three years past, occasioned
by the codling moth.

My attention was first drawn to
this subject from the fact that I
observed an advertisement of a
good fruit in this country, and
upon inquiring I found that it was
general.

Utah apples would hold the
highest rank in the market, and
supply the eastern market, but
without being dried they require
a serious outlay in packing and
shipping. But this is not the case
with Salt Lake of dried peaches,
which if we were to increase
the quantity to ten times the next
season, would not be more than
overlooked, for wherever dried
peaches have been introduced,
they have invariably found ready
sale.
