"I hereby resign the office of Governor of the State of Ohio. My resignation to take effect on the

2d day of March next. "Signed, R. B. HAYES."

Upon receipt of the telegram Lieutenant Governor Thomas L Young was notified of Governor Hayes resignation. He at once pro-ceeded to the Executive Department, where the oath of office, as governor, was administered to him by Chief Justice Welch, in presence of the State officers and many citizens of the city. Governor Young left for Washington at noon.
