

J. R. MANN AFTER THE WOOD PULP TRUST.

BABY OF TWENTY-TWO.

A Young Woman in an English Village Who Has Never Grown Up.

In an isolated cottage by a quiet by-road in the small hamlet of Cove, Devon, England, lives a girl who, though 22 years old, has never grown up.

Her name is Mildred Hart, and she is the daughter of a carpenter. Since she was 5 years of age she has not developed either physically or mentally. Her teeth are those set out as an infant, and she has retained all her baby ways.

The London Daily Mail tells of this girl who has never grown up as follows: She was seated in a baby's chair, nursing a doll when a correspondent entered the cottage. Every now and again she would kiss the doll and then hold it up to her younger sister, a tall girl of 20, with the command in broad Devon, "Kissum."

Her clothes, even to her little socks and shoes, are such as one is accustomed to see on a child of 5. She takes some pride in her garments. She is not so much of a conversationalist as some children of 5, and will answer every question put to her. When her sister asked her who made her clothes, she replied, "Mamma," and answered several other queries in monosyllables. Her mother still nurses her daughter just as she did 17 years ago. The girl dislikes going to bed, and insists on remaining downstairs till her parents retire for the night, when she is put in a little cot in their room.

The parents cannot assign a reason for the arrested development of their child, but it appears that two sisters of one of the child's grandmothers failed to develop in the same way. One died at the age of 3, and the other at 15. The girl enjoys the best health, and is much more contented than the ordinary child of 5. She will sit for hours at a stretch nursing her doll. Every one in the hamlet has a kindly word for her when she is driven out in her malice. She smiles back the greetings, and is usually very good tempered. There are five members of the family, one of the sons being a stalwart member of the Metropolitan police force.

Such cases, writes a medical correspondent, are not common in this country, but are well known medically, being due to what is called "cretinism," a condition in which the thyroid gland in the lower part of the neck is affected. Sufferers usually have a heavy, dull, sleepy expression and manner, the features being coarse and thick. The mental deficiency is usually more marked. The condition is supposed to be due to the absence of an "internal secretion" of the thyroid gland, which has the effect of stimulating the metabolism of the body, though how, or what it is, we do not yet know. Very satisfactory results have ensued from the administration of an "extract of thyroid gland" from animals. The stature is increased rapidly, the intelligence is improved, the bodily functions become more normal, and general improvement is maintained as long as the "thyroid extract" is taken. Degeneration, however, results if treatment is abandoned.

It is a curious fact that these cases are noticed particularly to come from certain districts, especially the Rhone valley in France, parts of Derbyshire in England, and so on, and it is suggested that some peculiarity in the water has some connection with it.

PIERPONT MORGAN AS A COLLECTOR

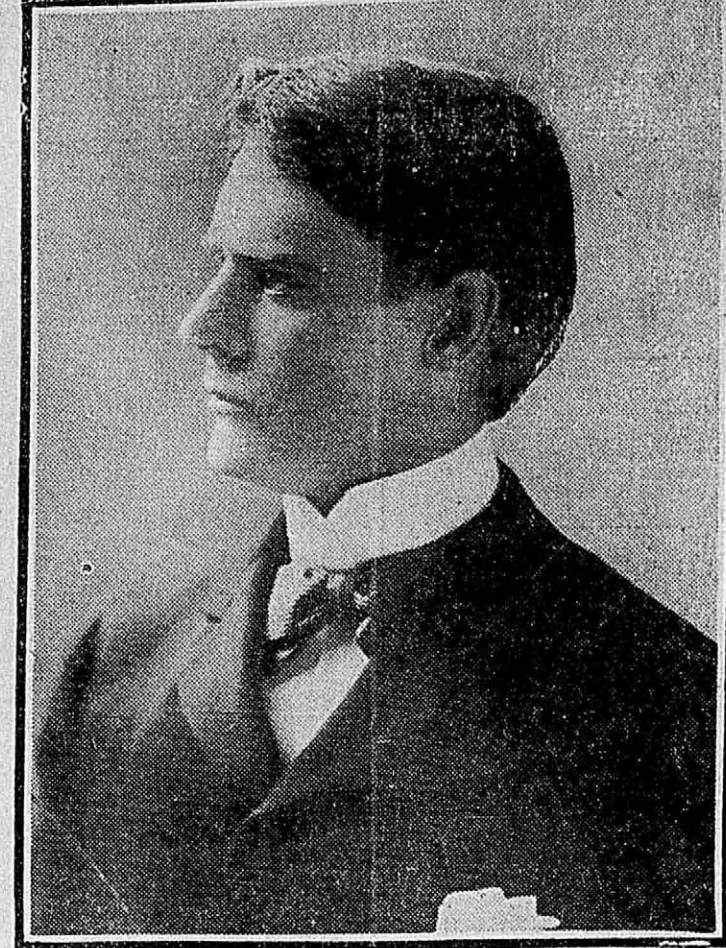
When Pierpont Morgan's yellow yacht returns to the lagoons the Venetians tremble for the fate of the St. Mark's. They rejoice that the statue of Colosseus is a thing of weight and that the Campanile when raised

will not be portable. We, for our part, may doubt what satisfaction from the reflection that a deal in the dome of St. Paul's is at present impossible that traffic in the stones of Westminster Abbey would be premature. These remarks are suggested by the fact which will be found illustrated elsewhere, that Pierpont Morgan is not only the Napoleon of finance, but an unrepentant conqueror in the pursuit of curios. He is the possessor of a marvellous collection of chaises and vestments from the churches of Italy and France, each success in this line of enterprise excites among the pious and the cultivated upon the continent a feeling of grief and despair. Negotiations, it appears, have now been opened for the sale of the ancient chaise belonging to the parish church of the village of Churchill, near Worcester. Local indignation threatens to forbid the sale and to rob the great collector of his latest prize. Antiquaries in their wrath accuse Pierpont Morgan of marauding in his domestic museum an array of spoils as splendid and impious as the Feast of Belsazzar.
