# ROYAL HUMANITARIANS.

NEWS recently received from Europe would almost lead one to think that the rulers of the nations there are beginning to be slightly troubled with qualms of conscience with respect to the horrors of war-a game, in playing at which they seem to take so much delight.

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We were informed that the Czar of all the Russias, as he is called, desires to do away with the use of torpedoes and explosive projectiles, for the use of which modern warfare is fast becoming so notorious, and whose effects must necessarily intensify and aggravate the sufferings of those who may be wounded in war. Another statement is that these humantarian views extend only to the discontinuance of explosive projectiles, not including the torpedo. It is also stated that the project has been viewed favorably by Napoleon.
