## ANTI-CHINESE MOBS.

Indians Under Arms and the National Guards Called Out.

THE CELESTIALS READY TO FIGHT.

A Law and Order Meeting Called to Protect against the Indians. Proceedings.

**SAN FRANCISCO,** Cal., Sept. 1.—Sheriff Smith has gone to Redwood, having been called up by the citizens of that city to aid in suppressing rioters who threatened to drive out the Chinese by force of arms, thus evicting a large number of negroes who have gone with him, who will act in conjunction with the police force of Redwood, sheriff Smith also telegraphed to Governor Markham, asking him to order out the national guard. The sheriff said that the Federals sent a note to his chief, asking him to protect the Chinese.

Governor Markham, in response to Sheriff Smith's message, has ordered the national guard to be on duty to help the necessary steps to have the San Joaquin companies at San Francisco and Redwood in readiness to repel any mob.

The Chinese of this city and Redwood, for a number of days, have been spending themselves with shotgun and revolver in anticipation of trouble last night the Chinese of the city barricaded themselves in their houses, and were prepared with firearms to resist attack. A mass meeting was held tonight or tomorrow night to admit about 200 Chinese residents in the city to leave at once.
