## AN ORDINANCE

ticensing and Regulating the Manufac ture and Sale of Spiritums and Formented Liquors.

Sec I. Be it ordained by the City Council of Salt Lake City, that no person shall, in said City, directly or indirectly, in person or he secther manufacture, sell, barter, or or by another, manufacture, sell, barter, or otherwise dispose of, or permit to be manu-factured, bartered or delivered, for or on his account, any spirituous or fermented liquors, without a license first obtained inquors, without the provisions of this Order ance, as a dram or tippling shop keep liquor dealer, wine dealer, beer saloon kee or, distiller or brower.
