NYE LABEL SUIT  
TO BE DISMISSED.

That Against Councilmen Cottrell And Fernstrom Will Be Wiped Off the Docket

WHEN JUDGE MORSE RETURNS.

Complaint Charged That Defendants Published a Fake Statement Concerning City Attorney.

The Nye-Cottrell-Fernstrom criminal libel case will be dismissed by District Attorney Elchorn as soon as Judge Morse returns from Kansas, which will be in the early part of January. City Attorney Nye, who is the complaining witness against President Charles Cottrell, Jr., of the city council, and Councilman F. S. Fernstrom, yesterday afternoon notified the district attorney that the case could be dismissed. At the time Judge Tanner certified the case to the district court without a preliminary hearing it was stated by the "News" that the case was up in the air. It seemed that it was remained so up to the present time and it will now be wiped off the docket entirely.

THE ALLEGATIONS.  
The complaint against the two councilmen was filed by City Attorney Nye on June 23 and charged that, on June 15, 1903, they published a certain false and malicious statement in a committee report of the council to the effect that the city attorney's office was being investigated by the grand jury. Cottrell and Fernstrom were arrested on June 24 and the next day appeared before Judge Diehl and entered pleas of not guilty to the charge. On July 13 they asked for a change of judge and the case was transferred to Judge Tanner, those two being the only judges of the city court, the case was certified to the district court by Judge Tanner before any preliminary hearing was had. The case has been in that condition ever since, and will now be dismissed and disposed of definitely.

CHANGE OF VENUE.

The county attorney then filed an affidavit asking for a change of venue to the district court on the grounds of prejudice on the part of Judge Tanner. It appearing that the defense had taken a change of judge on account of the prejudice of Judge Tanner, those two being the only judges of the city court, the case was certified to the district court by Judge Tanner before any preliminary hearing was had. The case has been in that condition ever since, and will now be dismissed and disposed of definitely.
