He Tells All About the Weather Thir-ty-Four Years Ago. "Doe" Hyatt, meteorological prognosti cator for these parts, may not be much on telling what the weather is to be beho fore it gets here, but he certainly does know what as happened in the dim visknow what as happened in the dim vis-tus of the past-and even earlier than that. When it comes to remembering just what kind of weather was consid-ered the fashion 34 years ago, how many men of today could quality? Not many, it is true-but there is one man here who can do it. That is "Doc" Hyatt, Re-garding the weather of past years, he has the following to say: The coldest September during the period occurred in 1884, during which the average temperature was 59 de-grees, and the warmest month was in 1888, when the mercury recorded an average of 71 degres. Sept. 22 is men-tioned as the date when the first "kill-ing" frost has occurred in years past with the last on April 23. In the matter of precipitation, the average for the month in the years that have passed has amounted to .84 of an inch, with only four days when one or more inches of rain fell. The greatest amount of precipitation in any one period of 24 hours during any September was 1,84 inches, which happened Sept. 1 and 2 m 1886. It shows that 1825 and 1890 were the only two years when there was a trace of snow recorded. The average number of clear days during the month were 19, partly cloudy 8, and cloudy 3.
