

Washington, 16.—Almost immediately after the opening of the Senate, Edmunds moved an executive session, but yielded to the request for the transaction of the morning business.

Davis presented a memorial of the Massachusetts Legislature, which was read. The memorial recited that the general court of Massachusetts viewed with deep concern the recent interferences of the Government of Canada with the rights of fishermen and urges Congress to secure immediate relief for that class of citizens.




