

JAPAN WANTS NO ARBITRATION

Cannot Accede to China's Suggestion Manchurian Questions Be Referred to The Hague.

SHOWS LACK OF COURTESY.

Attributes Change of Attitude to "Malign Influence" but Fails to Indicate Source.

Tokio, March 30.—The Japanese government has asserted in the most positive terms that it is unable to accede to the suggestion of China that pending questions with regard to Manchuria be referred to The Hague for arbitration. It maintains that this suggestion shows a lack of courtesy and it attributes the Chinese change of attitude in this matter to "malign influence."

Answering a request for an expression of the views of the government concerning China's proposal that the Manchurian questions be referred to The Hague, the foreign office today gave out the following carefully worded statement:

"Several questions between Japan and China of more or less importance, with reference to Manchuria, remain unsettled. Some are complicated, but all readily could be made to yield to the diplomatic process of give and take."

"Japan, fully appreciating the advantages of settling all causes of misunderstanding from her relations with her neighbors, made proposals to China looking to the final settlement of outstanding differences. These proposals were framed in a spirit of consideration and conciliation, and were in no sense an ultimatum. Japan expected that the terms offered would serve as a basis of negotiation or as points of departure for reciprocal concessions and accommodations."

"China at first apparently accepted Japan's friendly overtures in the spirit in which they were tendered, but malign influences were permitted to prevail, and without discussing the questions or making any counter proposals, China categorically rejected Japan's offer and suggested recourse to The Hague."

"In adopting this extraordinary course, China is guilty not only of slight discourtesy to Japan, but has disregarded one of the expressed provisions of The Hague convention, and has completely reversed the usual course of procedure. Article 41 of The Hague convention declares that the court is maintained for the 'object of facilitating recourse to arbitration of international differences impossible to settle by diplomacy.'"

"In the present case the resources of diplomacy have not only not been exhausted, but they have not even been appealed to. The questions in dispute have not been made the subject of full detailed discussion and negotiation between the two governments, and no attempt has been made to compose the differences or ascertain how far they are irreconcilable."

"The questions are not ripe for such references; diplomatic effort would first have to be exhausted and the exact points at issue ascertained and specified."

"The controversy covers a wide range of interests and calls for a correspondingly wide range of accommodation. The powers immediately concerned having plenty of authority to pool all influences if necessary, are alone competent to settle the questions in a satisfactory manner and no solution not satisfactory to all concerned will stand the test of time and the stress of competing interests."

"It is therefore extremely unfortunate that China has allowed herself to be persuaded to make the wholly impracticable suggestion of arbitration."

PREST. TAFT PRAISES DR. CHARLES W. ELIOT

Washington, March 30.—Senator Root of New York, speaking at a dinner tendered to retiring President Charles W. Eliot of Harvard university, tonight, at which President Taft was also present, indicated the choice of Dr. Eliot as American ambassador to Great Britain. Mr. Root declared that before whatever monarch Dr. Eliot shall stand, "we will know our great republic in all its good qualities is represented by a true American gentleman."

President Taft followed Senator Root and Dr. Eliot with a short address, in which he warmly praised the retiring president of Harvard.

"In a small person," he declared, "Mr. Taft is taking off the armor while none of us is."

WOMAN KIDNAPER WAIVES HEARING

Pennsylvania Authorities Will Make Every Effort to Secure Mrs. J. H. Boyle's Conviction.

HER IDENTITY A MYSTERY.

She is Not Anne McDermott, the Detectives Having Run Down That Theory.

Merced, Pa., March 30.—Mrs. James H. Boyle will not be taken to Sharon for a hearing on the charge of kidnapping little Willie Whittle. Atty. Cochran, counsel for Mr. Whittle, today said it had been arranged to give the woman an opportunity to waive a legal paper to the effect that she desired to waive a hearing without going to Sharon.

Atty. Cochran said every effort would be made to obtain a conviction in the woman's case, but if it failed she would be turned over to the Cleveland authorities, having been indicted in that city on the charge of blackmail.

He further asserted there was no intention of eliminating the woman from the case, and detectives would continue to work up to the time of trial, searching for evidence against her.

"The woman is as much of a mystery now as at any time since she was arrested," declared Atty. Cochran. "Absolutely nothing has been learned concerning her identity."

He says detectives have run down the McDermott theory, and found she was not connected with the Chicago family, nor does the family, he says, "know her."

It was learned today that Mrs. Boyle received a visit from a man at the Mercer jail yesterday morning, who is supposed to have been her brother. The woman says her visitor was her brother, but when Sheriff Chess returned from Sharon with Boyle, he expressed the opinion that the visitor had been an accomplice of the woman.

In any event the visit was apparently carefully arranged, and as a result was made at a time when the exception of the sheriff's wife, there was no one around the jail to see what the man looked like, question him or discover anything that would lead to the real identity of the visitor.

The man did not register at any of the hotels. He did not eat a meal in Mercer.

LETTERS TURNED OVER.

Sharon, Pa., March 30.—The Whittle family left here today presumably for Atlantic City. Before going away Mr. Whittle turned 25 threatening letters over to the postal authorities. These letters have been received yesterday and today.

One letter states that unless Mr. Whittle uses every effort to free the prisoners, the house will be dynamited. A second letter demands that \$5,000 be deposited at some point in Ohio, which money, it is said, will be used to defend the Boyles.

PAPA ISIO'S DEATH SENTENCE IS COMMUTED

Manila, March 31.—Gov. Gen. Smith has commuted the death sentence of Papa Isio, the black pope of the tribesmen inhabiting the island of Negros. ADMIRAL BERESFORD MAY ENTER POLITICS

London, March 30.—There is strong prospect that the picturesque and popular admiral of Admiral Lord Charles Beresford will be seen immediately in the thick of the political struggle, throwing fresh fuel on the naval agitation.

England's foremost admiral always has been outspoken concerning his views, and since his return to London, after having been relieved of the command of the channel fleet, he has declared he would do all in his power to stir up the country to insist upon a large and particularly a more efficient navy.

Lord Charles had a long discussion on naval affairs with Premier Asquith today. He regards the shortage of reserve stores as the chief present weakness of the navy, although the state of repairs of the smaller craft is most unsatisfactory to him. For the effects, Lord Charles blames the economic policy of the cabinet ministers, particularly the chancellor of the exchequer, David Lloyd George, whom he designates as a "little devil" man and whose interests, he declares, are chiefly old age pensions and other domestic projects.

The debate in the house of commons yesterday appears almost to have flattened the little navy party. Newspapers that have heretofore been its strongest organs, now say that it is impossible for the country to run the smallest risk of being overtaken by Germany in the construction of battle-ships.

There are good reasons for believing that the cabinet has already decided to build eight Dreadnoughts, and has notified the ship-builders of the intention to lay down the second four within the fiscal year.

Port Stratton from Washington. The government has set its face against indulgence in the delights of the "dope pipe" and prohibited the importation of opium of anything less than medicinal purity after April 1. That was bad enough, but the bustling importers rushed their orders to the orient and nearly a million dollars' worth of the drug was landed here a few days ago and safely stored in the custom house and bonded warehouses. In time, it was supposed, to evade the new regulation.

Now the authorities at Washington have instructed Collector Stratton not to allow any opium to leave his possession on or after April 1, and the vast hoard of opium dreams is doomed to go unsmoked.

The government authorities further declare that a careful reading of the pure food and drug law which raises the bars against dope smokers makes it possible for federal officials to seize and confiscate any opium found any place in the country after April 1, whether marked "duty paid" or not. If this ruling is enforced the opium importers of San Francisco stand to lose a large sum as within the last two days alone nearly \$200,000 worth has been withdrawn from the customs house on payment of duty. It is estimated that opium valued at between \$1,000,000 and \$1,500,000 is now in and near this city, all of which is open to seizure wherever found.
