United States Sends an Agent to Venezuela to Look Into Situstion and Make Report.

VERY MUCH DEPENDS UPON IT

Diplomatic Relations After Having Been Severed for Eight Months May be Re-established.

Washington, Dec. 25 .- After eight months the United States resumed friendly relations with Venezuela and William 1. Buchanan has left on the cruiser North Carolina to visit that country, look into the situation and make a report to the state depart-This will deside whether the United States will accord formal recognition to the government. It has not yet been fully established that the Gomez government will retain its pow-er without trouble, for there are many er without trouble, for there are many adherents of President Castro in the country. Indeed, the possibility that disorder may arise is indicated in a request for an Amreican warship at La Guaird, to which this government has promptly responded. The general opinion is that the new order of things will open the way for the pacific settlement of Venezuela's disagreements with this country, Hol-land and France.

disagreements with this country, Hol-land and France. The refusal in March last by the Castro administration to consider sep-arately the issues with the United States made it plain that diplomacy could accomplish nothing further to-ward their settlement. The five claims which form the basis of the last nego-tiations were those of A. F. Jurett, who was expelled from the country; the New York and Bermudez Asphalt com-pany and the United States and Venpany and the United States and Ven-ezuelan company, the Orinoco corpora-tion and the Orinoco Steamship com-

tion and the Orinoco Steinship com-pany, the amounts involved running into millions of dollars. In 1903 the Venezuelan government having failed to satisfy claims against it by various powers, Great Britain, Germany and Italy blockaded the ports of that country with the view to the forceful collection of the debts. Vene-zuela appointed Herbert W. Bowen, then American minister to Venezuela, as a commissioner to take up the quesas a commissioner to take up the ques-tion with the various governments and he signed protocols with them where-

tion with the various governments and he signed protocols with them where-by a certain percentage of the customs receipts was to be set aside to satisfy the claims. The blockading powers were made preferred creditors. The revocation of the transahipment decree of May 14, by the Venezuelan government was announced today by Foreign Minister Van Swinderen. It was this decree that made most of the trouble between Venezuela and the Netherlands. Under its terms tho transchipment of goods at Willemstad destained for Venezuela was prohibited. This worked much injury to the com-merce of the Dutch island. The for-eign minister said also that the Dutch naval operations along the Venezuelan coast had been suspended, at the re-quest of Acting President Gomez. CASTRO IS A SICK MAN.
