It was announced at the home of Roar Admiral C. H. Chester, retired, that a public statement of the hodings of the society probably will be fortheoming Wednesday. This rapidity in determining the graumeness or Peary's claim is taken to mena that there is no difference among the three experts Peary declined positively to discuss his testimony before the committee. 

RATHER HARD TO SWALLOW.

Old Fashloned Rebel Yell Was Given And Resolution Adopted With A Whoop.

New Orleans, Nov. 1.-Adopting President Tart's suggestion that the time for oratory was passed, the Lakesto-the-Gulf Deep Waterways conven tion tonight decided to send 500 lobbyists to Washington to demand that Congress deepen the Mississippi river.

A resolution to that effect, offered by David R. Francis of Missouri, was adopted. It follows:

Resolved, That the president of the Lakes-to-the-Gulf Deep Waterways as-sociation be requested to appoint 500 delegates from our organization to visit delegates from our organization to visit. Washington and to present the proper committee of Congress and the heads of our government the resolutions adopted by this convention, and at the same time to act as delegates to the rivers and harbors congress, to be held in Washington, Dec. 8, 9 and 10."

There was silence for a moment after the resolution was read. The lobby idea apparently choked many delegates for the moment. Then somehody turned loose an old tashiened rubel yell, and whoop. In the confusion it is, doubtful if 10 delegates knew the regular report of the resolution committee had been adopted. The resolution declared the federal government "should enterupon a definite polley and plan of wasterways development, beginning with the improvement of the Mischesppl and Illinois rivers as a main trunk of a the improvement of the absesseppi and illinois rivers as a main trunk of a great waterways system, in such a way as to open effective navigation between the Gulf of Mexico and the Great Lakes, such main trunk line to be developed with no disparagement of and

onstant reference to the concurrent de-

constant reference to the concurrent development of the tributaries."

The issuance of popular bonds in small denominations was urged upon Congress as a means of paying for the great undertaking.

Representative D. E. McKinley of California was one of the speakers at the afternoon session. He made a spirited argument for improving the inland waterways. He came as a doubter, he said, but was now converted to the cause.
