The arguments of anti-Mormon preachers are usually based upon false premises. The common method is to assume something ridiculous as the creed of the "Mormons" and then proceed to deride and refute it. This pleases persons opposed to "Mormonism" but only confirms its adherents. The class of men detailed to missionary work in Utah is of an inferior grade. It is rare that a man of sincerity and talent figures here as a representative of any of the leading sects. If he is honest-hearted he is not brilliant.
