Joseph Argyle rejoiced that the day had arrived for us to hold our Conference. We should as Saints feel very thankful to our Heavenly Father for the great principles of life which he had again restored to the earth for our salvation.

Elder John Morgan stated that during the past month he had passed through an experience that he never had to before in his life, and prayed never to have to again. During the trial of the assassins of Elder Joseph Standing, that he had just been attending, in Whitfield County, Ga., the spirit of mobocracy which was there far surpassed anything he had ever witnessed; he never before could realize the spirit that existed in the days of our Savior, and that persecuted, destroyed and killed many of the people of God in former and in latter days. The killing of Elder Standing has not stopped the energies of the Elders, but to the contrary, it will be the means of many of the people investigating the principles of the Gospel.

Prayer by Martin Garn.
Elder John Morgan read the second chapter of Joel, commencing at the 29th verse. We as Latter-day Saints believe that this scripture is yet to be fulfilled. If this has not been fulfilled, it is of great importance to us, as there will be safety only in Zion and Jerusalem. Here we have two places for deliverance for us, and we are calling upon the people to repent of their sins and gather home to Zion, which God has designated as the gathering place for this people.

Prayer by Elder J. Argyle.
Elder G. H. Carver read the second chapter, 11th, 12th and 13th verses of Romans, commenting upon the agency that God has given to mankind, that by obeying the word of God, man fell, and it will be by obedience to the everlasting gospel that he will return to his Heavenly Father.

Elder Martin Garn read the first chapter of James, 5th and 6th verses, commenting on the general belief that God had not spoken since the days of the Apostles nor will until His second coming. All things pertaining to God are understood by the Spirit of God and in no other way, and if the gifts and blessings were only to follow the Apostles, their salvation belonged to them alone. His testimony was that God had spoken in these our days and restored the everlasting gospel, which will lead us back to our Father in Heaven, inasmuch as we comply with the principles thereof.

Elder Hyrum Belnap said, "Seek first the kingdom of God." The kingdom of God is His government here on the earth. It takes a king, laws, officers and subjects to constitute a kingdom here known among mortal man, and the kingdom of God is similar, only that His is perfect, and the former is not. All His officers are duly appointed and have the right to administer in the ordinances of the Gospel, and admit aliens into His kingdom. Unless a person has the right to officiate, all his proceedings are invalid, and will not be recognized by God.

Elder John Morgan said, We recognize Pres. John Taylor as the mouthpiece of God to this people, just as much so as Moses was the lawgiver and prophet to Israel anciently. The order of the church and all the quorums are in perfect order, and each and every one moving in its place, and all move harmoniously together.

Elder John Morgan said, the same difficulty exists to-day, as existed in the days of our Savior, with regard to a prophet. The people rejected in the days of old, John the Baptist, Peter, John, and many others because they came in the name of the Lord, and the same objection exists with the people in our day with regard to a living prophet. The people to-day are not any more ready to receive a prophet of God than they were in the days of the Savior.

Elder Joseph Argyle said, we the servants of God are calling upon all men and women to come and be co-workers with us, and God to bring about a reign of righteousness upon the earth. God has drawn the line and He through His servants is calling upon the Saints to gather to the place which He has designated. We are willing to spend our time and life to teach the children of men the ways of truth and righteousness. He asked God, his Heavenly Father to enable all to see and comprehend the principles of the gospel.
