**LOCAL AND OTHER MATTERS.**

**THERMOMETER** 39 degrees F. in the shade at 1 p.m. to-day. Fine day.

**Confirmed.**—It will be seen by our dispatches that the Senate of the U. S. has confirmed the nomination of Geo. A. Black as Secretary for Utah. Better have George than a worse fellow.

**Theatre.**—For to-morrow evening, for the first time here, will be produced the sensational drama of "Midnight, or the Thirteenth Shilme," also the popular farce of "French Spoken Here," an attractive bill. The various characters are in able hands.

**He Got It.**—Mr. John Sholdebrand was the fortunate individual who drew the first prize painting in the National Bazaar of Yosemite Valley, by Mr. G. M. Ottinger, secretary of the Art Union drawing, this afternoon. It is valued at \$50.

**Forgery Trial.**—To-day A. F. Delane was tried in the Third District Court on an indictment for forgery and uttering a forged note, with intent to defraud. The case was given to the jury shortly after two o'clock.

**Pickpockets.**—About 11 o'clock on Wednesday night, as William J. Smith, was passing along the Second South street, an unknown person suddenly darted toward him, snatched away his silver watch and gold chain and ran as fast as his legs would. The watch is new and has nickel works and is worth \$35. "St. Imier," the name of the place where it was made, is engraved on the works.

**"Nolle Prosequi."**—In the case of the People, &c., vs. Abraham Rasin, indicted for intended exposure of the person, the district attorney submitted a statement to the Court of what he expected to prove, being that the exposure took place before two persons, and the attorney for the defendant came forward and showed that such a case did not constitute an offence under the statute on which the indictment was founded as it related to acts of open or public exposure. The Court sustained the view of the defending attorney, and the district attorney entered *nolle prosequi* in the case.

**Jack Beegan Escapes.**—The history of Jack Beegan has been so interwoven with the criminal statistics of the Western States and Territories that nearly everybody in these parts knows him by reputation. Last Tuesday he was convicted in the Third District Court of robbing one Sharp in this City about two years ago, and yesterday a jury of the same Court brought a verdict against him of guilty of manslaughter, as stated in the News. Early last evening he requested that he might be allowed to go to a certain place in town where he said he had some clothing that he might get a change of, and the request was granted, and he was accompanied by deputy U. S. Marshal Griffith, the chief bailiff of the Court. The two stopped in Lollie's saloon, where they took a drink." While the marshal, who is as agile as a cat, bolted to the rear of the saloon through a back door, out into the street and over a board fence, into the backyard of the Saddle Rock Restaurant. The marshal drew a pistol, raised it and fired, but the bullet went and he was on the fence. Beegan, with being sharpened with a desire to breathe once more the air of liberty, he placed Mrs. Wagener, the restaurant, between him and the marshal, making her a shield for his own person, and in this passed into the establishment.

Griffith descended from the second and returned through the saloon at full speed, pistol in hand, with a view of intercepting Beegan at the front. In running through the saloon the marshal tripped up and fell sprawling on the floor. On regaining his feet he discovered that Beegan had vanished, and, since then, so far as is known, no tidings have been received of him. We are informed that another deputy
