They interine that the Gen-should have nothing to do with en-forcing these prohibitions beyond the provision of the necessary means for enabling the judicial power to make them effectual as the supreme law of the land.

But now we have amendments that constitution which are claimed to have enlarged the legis-lative power of Congress by the creation of a substantive and af-

creation of a substantive and al-firmative power to do what is de-scribed as "enforcing" the new prohibitions which those amend-ments have addressed to the State. It is to be observed that these new prohibitions do not differ in their nature from the old ones. Like the old ones they are simply declara-tions or provisions of a fundamental and imperative character that the States shall not do certain things. Thus, the fourteenth amendment declares that "no State

amendment declares that "no State shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States, nor deprive any per-son of life, liberty of property without due process of law, nor de-ny to any person within its juris-diction the equal protection of the laws;" and the fifteenth amend-ment declares that "the right of laws;" and the fifteenth amend-ment declares that "the right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be demed or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of color, race or previous condition of servitude." It is plain that these provisions can all be enforced by the judicial power of the United States with-out any intervention by Congress, if left to their own operation. But what is the meaning and
