Mrs. Farley sang beautifully "Jesus is Calling." A funeral cortege nearly a half mile long followed her remains to their last resting place. Many large and beautiful floral tributes were brought by relatives and friends, all evidencing love and esteem in which Sister Clough was held in this city.

She came here on her last visit in August, and never returned to her home in Chouse, where she has a daughter and two grandchildren living. Her name will live long in the memories of the many missionaries who have partaken of her kindness and motherly hospitality.

VOLUNTARY MANSLAUGHTER.

Verdict of Jury in Hopson Case—Logan Stirred Up Over A. C. Controversy.

Logan, Cache Co., March 12.—The Hopson murder case closed last night and went to the jury at 5:45 p. m. The verdict was returned at 10:30 p. m. and was directed towards proving that Lynch was a rather bad man.
