HEAT EFFICIENCY.

Fernstrom made an objection to the efficiency of the gas to be furnished by the company. He said that the Utah Light & Rallway company fur-nished gas of 600-heat-unit standard while this franchise would only provide for 250 heat-unit gas. He thought that according to that standard the old com-pany would be furnishing cheaper gas than the new because it would take than the new because it would take nearly three times as much gas at 250 heat-units to furnish the same heat as t would at 600 heat-units. Mr. Darst splained that the gas his company in-ended to furnish would be water gas while the old company furnishes dry dal gas. The water gas he said procoal gas. The water gas he said pro-duced much more heat than the dry yas and further, he stated, that in 60 per cent of the citles of the United States water gas of the 250 heat-unit was being used instead of coal gas. This matter was finally referred to the city engineer for consideration. The franchise was referred to the city at-torney to insert the amendments agreed upon and to return the same to the council on Monday night.
