This very ancient Empire has borne in its time many names, for it was a custom when a new dynasty ascended the throne to rive another name to the Empire, as Hai-que, Chum-que, Han-que, etc., accorping to the name of the ruling monarch. a Semitic origin, and that they were also the work of a pastoral popple. Had the Phenicians taken the first idea of writing from the Egyptians, they would naturally have given to their letter signs the form of objects with which they were familiar. But so far from this being the case, their sign language contains no trace ships or seafaring life; on the contrary it does bear positive evidence of an in-

land and pastoral people. The Phenician origin of the alphabet is supported by the following argu-

ment: that the names of the letters are Phenician and not Syrian; that i is not probable that the Aramaic dialect was the language of the inventors and if the Phenician letters are picto rial, there is no model found by the older Babylonian discoverers of writing after which they could be formed But whethor the Phenicians were the inventors of the Semitic alphabet or not, there can be no doubt but that they were the chief disseminators of it, which view is generally accepted by the majority of writers on philology. The ancient Hebrew alphabet, on which all modern languages to a great-er or less degree are based, originally consisted of twenty-two letters, each letter representing an object or an

Like most of the ancient huguages, Hebrew was first written without any division or punctuation, the letters all running together, as it were.
