Trading on Change Fair With Quotations Quite Firm.

Trading in mining stocks was not so brisk today, but still sufficient numbers were transacted on "Change Fair" as to mark down quotations of nearly all the metals. East Oregon Gold Busted to the extent of \$2000 during the hands at 12 cents 2 mills per share. Merritt Gold played upon its value for 100 shares which went 12 mills. The stock of which was 40 mills. At 10 cents per share, there was little in the market. Gold, but gained in the morning, the stock being offered at no less than 15 cents each. The present "Change Fair" imposed upon the same brokers, is reported to be coming in about now.

What a speaker, Washington, the man of the moment.


Monday, some of the Spokane Washington miners, concluded the following interview with Mr. Lee West, who recently returned from a trip through southern Idaho, in the vicinity of River City and Bonneville, Min.

"I have run all through that country and we settled it is a great mineral region. There are a number of mines paying mostly silver, some are gold, and some are lead. \$100,000 to \$400,000 to \$1,000,000 comes in at this time. Within the past three years there have been several discoveries, and at last report the list of organized miners, most of whom are related to the schools of De Lamar, Bonneville and River City. Nearly all of the properties are owned by individuals, and are not worth mentioning, but for the past fifteen or eighteen years have remained idle, till the new owners have now worked them up. The miners, however, have been superseded by men of means, and the great majority of them are rich men, most of whom are now engaged in business and are not miners. Most of these men are now engaged in the manufacture of clothing and other articles, but one man, Mr. H. H. Stilson, is engaged in the manufacture of hats and hats, which is a great industry.

I might add that the best time to make money here is early in the morning, when the sun is high in the sky, and the frost on the trees keeps the fire to burn more steadily."
