from Manager L. L. Nunn of the Tel- erino Power company to furnish power to the city at \$5 for each horse-power per month, or at five cents per kilo-watt hour, or for one half of the gross receipts.

A lengthy discussion took place on the question of cost of electric power, lights, etc., the terms of the proposed contract, etc.

According to Mr. Hodge, the city council will be asked to call a special election to determine whether the city shall name bonds to complete the waterworks system and for the establishing an electric light plant, was then taken up.

The question was discussed at length, and D. B. Heutz offered an amendment that three propositions be presented to the people to vote upon, viz.: bonding for the completion of the waterworks extension to the present intake of the system; bonding for the purchase of the electric company's distributing plant; and the waterworks system and an electric plant.

A vote resulted in 99 voting for, and 2 against the motion, and the city council will take the matter up at its next meeting and issue a call for a bond election.
