Making Preparation for a Big Season at Lagoon.

C. R. & Q. FLOATS BONDS.

The Line from Cripple Creek to Denver Considered a Certainty by Colorado Papers.

Gen. Manager Handwerker, accompanied by Chief Engineer Vail, went over the line of the Salt Lake and Ogden railway yesterday with a view of making all improvements necessary in operating the road with the heavy locomotives lately received. In order to make the time between Lagoon and Salt Lake in thirty minutes during the coming season.

At Cripple Creek a new station and siding is being constructed, which will do away with one of the single locomotives made at this place called Purdie's Locomotive. At Lagoon, sidings have been put in of sufficient capacity so that three trains can be accommodated there at one time. The road is being extended from Lagoon to the north end of Farmington. The hauling facilities have been enlarged so as to furnish sufficient capacity for the heavy loads of lumber and coal.
