AUCTION OF SADDLE HORSES.

Kentucky Thoroughbreds Bring Biggest Prices on Record at New York Sale.

New York, March 28.—Outbidding a big throng of New York equestrians as well as some from Chicago last night William G. Rockefeller secured Four Cylinders, a chestnut gelding that carried the Lexington, Ky., title in a public race last season. Mr. Rockefeller paid \$3,000. This was said to be the highest price paid for a saddle horse at auction in New York since 1881. Bidding for all the 25 Kentucky saddle horses offered was extremely aggressive. The lot was sold in an hour and a half for \$23,000, an average of \$920. The total and average sales were as the top price, were the best recorded in five years in New York's market for saddle horses at auction.
