HELEN MIDDLEY SAVES TWO LIVES

Reckless Auto Driver Dashes Madly Toward Little Children.

HURT WHILE HELPING OTHERS

She is Struck by the Car When She Hurts Her Two Little Companions Out of Its Path.

A brave and plucky little 10-year-old girl and a reckless automobile driven figured in an accident last night that but for the quick-witted heroism of the girl, Helen Midgley, might have resulted in the serious injury of herself and her two cousins, John Mackenzie, aged 2 years, and Margaret Mackenzie, aged 5 years.

The three children were crossing Fifth East street near Second South street, when they found themselves caught between automobiles coming from opposite directions. One of the machines was a big touring car, containing four occupants, and driven at a reckless speed as it bore down on the children. Realizing the danger, Helen acted in the instant and fairly caught up the little boy and threw him towards the curb and then pushed the girl in the other direction out of harm's way. Before she could escape herself the car struck her on the hip, tearing her skirt into shreds and throwing her to the street.

The little boy was rendered unconscious by the force of his fall against the curb but was quickly revived, and aside from a few bruises none of the children suffered any serious injury.

Mr. Joseph Hirschvogel of 152 1/2 South Fourth East street, who was approaching the children from the opposite direction in a runabout was forced to swing his machine into the curb to escape the children as they were caught between the express wagon and the oncoming touring car. The driver and occupants of the latter were unknown to them.

ORDERS FOR UMBRELLA LINE

Tracks Must be Brought to Grade or Torn Up Entirely.

In order not to delay P. J. Moran, the official contractor, Mayor John S. Brannford instructed the city engineer to notify the West Side Rapid Transit company, otherwise known as the "Umbrella Line," that it must bring its tracks to grade at First West street where some paving is being done. Unless the request of the city engineer is complied with, the city will have to tear up the track and go ahead with its work. The company, which consists of one man and one car, has been ordered to pay the city its one and one-half mill on very far that has been collected this year. The city will revoke the franchise unless this is done immediately. L. L. Nunn, manager of the Telluride Power company of Provo, is the owner of the road.
