#### FORTY-SEVENTH CONGRESS

SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 11.—A bill was introduced by Senator Kenna to authorize and request the President to invite the production of foreign nations in the international exhibition of 1903.

By House, a resolution instructing the judiciary committee to report whether the assembling at Washington of large bodies of organized and armed troops not under command of officers of the United States is a dangerous precedent, and to provide in future a dangerous precedent, and whether any legislation or action by Congress be desirable.

House and Senate had no resolution to report, but was an expression of opinion on the practice which might otherwise become a dangerous precedent.

At St. Louis, Mo., the fire in the Victoria Dock, London, was doubtless incendiary.

The Windsor Spinning Co's cotton mill, Oldham, England, burned; loss \$400,000.

Joynes Edward Talleux, distinguished French sculptor and modeler, is dead.

Of the 55,555 emigrants to Canada last year, 47,270 proceeded to the United States.

The N. Y. Express denies that a portion of the stock of that paper had been sold to Jay Gould.

The Germans held a large meeting at St. Louis last night to protest against anti-German legislation.

The steamer *Batavia*, long overdue, was spoken, and is being towed by her propeller.

The Hussars and a battalion of foot are marching up to the relief of Gen. Colley, with reinforcements.

The performance in Booth's theatre, N. Y., to-day, for the benefit of the Poe statue fund, netted over \$5,000.

Professor Franklin Carter, of Yale, elected president of the American Association of University Professors.

Ann Reed, a medical university student at Ann Harbor, drowned herself in the lake. No cause is assigned.

The *Pail Mail* Gazette urges the stoppage of the hateful and bootless slaughter in Africa by making peace.

The House appropriation committee agreed to a bill providing an appropriation to search for the steamer *Jeannette*.

Fire this morning destroyed a frame building in Denver with the stock of fruit etc. Loss \$60,000; insured \$30,000.

The ice is moving out of Raritan and Delaware Rivers, and is thought great damage will be done. None is reported.

The sound fell remained outside all day yesterday, fearing to move through Hell Gate in the fog. They are now landing.

Fifteen inches of snow has fallen in Kansas since last night. The storm continues; a strong gale is blowing and snow drifting.

The Senate territorial committee, by Sanders, report favorably the bill creating the Territory of Pembina, off the northern half of Dakota.

According to estimates by the State agricultural bureau, the farm and live stock products of Illinois during 1900 aggregated \$236,000,000.

Two grandchildren of a former named Wagner, living near McHenry, Ill., perished in his house, which burned on Wednesday night.

Ellen E. Corse, wife of Gen. Corse, died at Burlington. She was a very prominent woman, and possessed great literary attainments as well.

The Kansas Southern passenger train has been stuck in a cut, two miles from Kansas City, since 11 last night. Two engines were at work all night.

Douglas, the Ute chief, who has been a captive for about a year, was started for Ft. Garland this morning, under the escort of Captain Keen.

Resolutions passed both houses of the Colorado legislature expressing sympathy with Ireland; also a resolution endorsing Belford's position on the silver question.

A snow storm, accompanied by high wind, has been prevailing all day at Omaha. Trains on most of the Nebraska railroads are either laid up or stuck in the snow.

The convention in favor of universal suffrage assembled yesterday at Omaha. The proceedings were uproarious. The people are supremely indifferent to the proceedings.

The House foreign committee will report that the Spanish claim in the last Florida war should be put in the way of adjustment and payment, with interest, by the United States.

The committee on foreign affairs has referred to a sub-committee Newberry's resolution for a joint committee of the Senate and House to investigate the Canadian fishery frauds.

The Muir Steel and Iron Company, limited, of England, has gone into liquidation. Liabilities \$258,000; assets, consisting principally of stock, premises and machinery, considerable.

On Wednesday, near Hillsboro, N. M., a party of citizens and cowboys attacked the fleeing Indians, killing eight or ten and routing them completely. The reds are making for Old Mexico.

Lipscomb, Capt. A. and G. F. Finch, of the 10th Cavalry, were in the fight with the Boers, and picked up nearly 100 hostile Sioux, who were subsisting on agency rations, making a total capture or surrender of 800.

It seems that Gen. Colley was defeated in the fight with the Boers, and narrowly escaped to camp, under cover of darkness, and that the Boers might have annihilated them had they pushed their advantage.

At Delos Alamos, N. M., Julien Vidal, a Mexican, killed his wife and young daughter, and severely wounded his son. The man hung himself to a rafter in the same room. Cause, insanity, produced by liquor.

The rush for Bernhard's season tickets at Memphis was so great that it soon became evident that speculators were taking hold of the house, and some \$100,000 worth of tickets were sold at a profit.
