

CONFERENCE OPENS WITH BIG ATTENDANCE

Feature of the Initial Session in the Big Tabernacle is the Opening Address by President Joseph F. Smith—He Urges Parents to See That Their Children Marry Latter-day Saints.

The eightieth semi-annual conference of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints opened Sunday morning in the tabernacle with every aisle and every available stand and floor space occupied. It was perhaps the largest opening session at any conference held in this city for years.

Present on the stand were President Joseph F. Smith, President John H. Winder and President Anthon H. Lund, of the quorum of the twelve there were present, President Francis M. Lyman, Elder John Henry Smith, Heber J. Grant, Elder R. B. Hanson, Elder S. M. Young, Elder J. W. McMillan, Charles H. Hart, of the presiding bishops, Elders C. W. Cannon, C. P. Miller and David A. Smith.

President Joseph F. Smith called the assembly to order and announced that the afternoon session would be held in the big tabernacle upon the grounds of the temple block.

The opening address was given by President Joseph F. Smith. He spoke of the importance of the conference and the need for unity and obedience among the members of the church.

President Smith urged parents to ensure that their children marry within the church, emphasizing the spiritual benefits and the importance of a strong family foundation.

President Anthon H. Lund followed, speaking of the church's growth and the need for continued devotion and service to God.

President John H. Winder addressed the assembly, focusing on the spiritual well-being of the members and the importance of maintaining the church's principles.
