# SPEEDY ANIMALS BEING ENTERED

Horses Seen in Fast Races Labor Day After State Fair Prizes.

## THE JUDGES ARE APPOINTED.

Supervisor Freed Makes Selections Bound to Please All And Has Other Good News.

Fast races are to be seen at the coming state fair, Oct. 5-10. This has been the promise and prediction made by President J. G. McDonald and Supervisor of fast horses, Lester D. Freed for a year back, and now that partial entry lists are out, the promises and predictions are backed up by the best kind of evidence. A card of 24 races has been arranged for fair week and a half dozen are already made up. Entries are coming in rapidly now, but it will be a few days before the full stable lists will be ready. But the horses are now busy with a season wind-up and the Colorado circuit is nearing a season-end. Horses from both tracks will come to Utah if their owners stand by their promises, say officials. "This much is certain," says one from Blackfoot, Idaho, "are coming sure, and it is almost certain another two dozen speedsters will represent the Gem state circuits in the fair races. Even owners on the Pacific coast have wired or written that they intend bringing horses in. All this interest being shown by neighboring and distant states is due to the general feeling of being hung up in the past years in the management of past meets."

## JUDGES APPOINTED.

Speaking of efficiency leads up to the fact that it was announced last evening the following three horse-lovers and c's (prominent citizens) have been selected by Supervisor Freed to act as judges: Dr. E.
