INDIAN FAMINE FUND.

The Deseret News, which is receiving contributions for the starving people of India, has received the following from the committee of one hundred in New York:

The receipts of our relief treasury are over \$200,000. The really organized effort has scarcely extended beyond two and a half months. The rate of daily receipts has been upwards of \$2,660. The contributions have come from every section of the country. Many of the gifts have been of small amounts—from one cent upward. Little children have saved money for the starving children of India. Boys have earned and collected money. Girls have held fairs and lawn-parties, and gently asked their friends for gifts.

Christian Endeavor, the both senior and junior have been amazingly ingenious in devising ways and means. The aged have sent loving, self-denying contributions. A hand of Chinamen in Oakland, California, forwarded a goodly sum, earned by extra labor. The inmates of the Ohio penitentiary made a purely free-will offering of considerable amount. No distinctions of race, or creed, or sectional or social condition, but provided the kindhearted givers.

Churches, other than factory operatives, members of trades of commerce and of boards of trade, students in schools and colleges, have gladly lent a helping hand.
