

PEABODY KEPT THE COMPACT.

After Being Installed as Governor of Colorado He Resigned and McDonald Was Sworn In.

CLAIMS HE WAS VINDICATED

Alva Adams Makes Statement—Feels Greatly Outraged, but Is Always For Law and Order.

Denver, Colo., March 17.—The resignation made by the leaders of the opposing Republican factions of Colorado to take the governor's chair from Alva Adams and to seat in it Lieut. Alva Adams, after permitting Jesse F. McDonald, after permitting Jesse F. McDonald, to hold it for one day, was carried to a conclusion late this afternoon.

The fulfillment of the agreement which was made before the general assembly which deposed the gubernatorial contest in his favor, Gov. James H. Peabody has resigned the office in which he was inaugurated yesterday afternoon.

His resignation was made in the presence of the general assembly, when it was written, was filed in the office of the secretary of state at 4:20 p. m. today.

James Cowie, secretary of state, immediately certified that Lieut. Alva Adams was sworn in as governor by Chief Justice Gabbert. There was no further ceremony.

Gov. Adams was ousted and Gov. Peabody installed by the general assembly at 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon, and Gov. McDonald was sworn in before 5 p. m. today. Thus in a space of less than 24 hours Colorado has had three governors.

Gov. Peabody transacted practically no business of state while in the office of governor. He received many callers who urged him not to resign, and also many messages of the same import by telegraph and telephone. To all these he replied that he did not care to hold the chair. He said that he was tired of the worry and excitement of his contest, and wished to go back to his bank in Canon City.

Half a dozen members of the national guard patrolled the corridors about the executive chamber during the day as a guard for Gov. Peabody.

Lieut. Gov. McDonald reluctantly takes the chair which Gov. Peabody resigned after forcing Gov. Adams out. The lieutenant governor has taken no part in the bitter fight over the governorship which has been waged ever since the election on Nov. 8. He absolutely refused to aid his friends in the legislature in their efforts to have him made governor, and, as ruling officer in the joint assembly, he made several rulings against the movement in his behalf.

Senator Arthur N. Connelley, president pro tem of the senate, becomes acting lieutenant governor by the elevation of the lieutenant governor to the office of chief executive.

In his letter of resignation, addressed to Sec. of State Cowie, Gov. Peabody stated that he contested the gubernatorial chair "believing then, and fully convinced now," that he received a plurality of the lawful votes cast for the office. It was a matter of duty to the people of Colorado and the Republican party that the contest should be prosecuted. He considered the decision of the legislature sending him a complete vindication of his course. Continuing, the letter reads:

"To my surprise and regret, I discovered toward the latter stages of the contest that certain members of the legislature, elected as Republicans, entertained feelings of ill will and dislike toward me personally.

"I shall not attempt in this communication to vindicate myself against what I conceive to be a personal and unjust, unwarranted by the facts and ungenerous to a degree, suffice it to say that I am now painfully conscious of its magnitude.

"I have always been and will ever

continue to be a faithful adherent of Republican principles and doctrines, and I conceive it to be the duty of every true citizen to make personal sacrifices, if need be, for the welfare of the political organization to which he may belong.

"Imbued with these sentiments, I am constrained to the conclusion that the best interests of the Republican party of this state will be subserved if I now retire to private life, hoping thereby that my present effort as a political factor in Colorado will restore peace and harmony now so sorely needed in the Republican party of this state."

ADAMS' STATEMENT.

"I am going back to my home and my business in Pueblo," said Alva Adams, who was deposed by the general assembly from the governorship after having served 65 days of the biennial term for which he was inaugurated on Jan. 10 last. "I am president of a savings bank and I have a hardware establishment, so I have no fear about the bread and butter proposition.

"At the same time," he added, "I am by no means in a hostile frame of mind. I have been outraged, and I feel the resentment that is natural. However, if the people can endure it, I can. My friends, many of them in the opposite party, have stood by me to the end. I shall never forget their devotion to the cause of right and simple justice. I was advised by some friends whose loyalty was supreme, to hold the office by force, but I never for a moment had an idea of accepting such advice. I am for law and order in the real sense of the phrase, and self-sacrifice is a part of my duty in accordance to that principle. I simply submit to the outrage that could not peaceably be prevented."

Indicted 151 Times by a Kentucky Grand Jury.

Morganfield, Ky., March 17.—The Union county grand jury today returned 151 indictments against the Standard Oil company for selling oil in retail lots without a license. The penalty is a fine of from \$50 to \$1,000 for each conviction.

News From Lieut. McCully.

Washington, March 17.—Lieut. Newton A. McCully, the representative of the United States navy with the Russian forces in Manchuria, was heard from today for the first time in three months. For a long time he was with the besieged forces in Port Arthur, but before the fall of that fortress he was permitted to go to Vladivostok from which place he subsequently proceeded north and joined Kuropatkin's army near Mukden. Today a cablegram was received from him, saying that Capt. Hudson and Col. Howard probably have been captured, but that Maj. McComb was "all right." The persons named are American army officers engaged in observing the operations of the Russian forces. The cable message is dated at Aomyn.

Yaqui Copper Co. Asks Protection

Washington, March 17.—Recently the local agents here of the Yaqui Copper company, an American corporation, whose mines are located in the state of Sonora, Mexico, applied to the state department to secure protection for its properties. The mines are about 40 miles distant from the nearest Mexican garrison post and the lives of the caretaker and his family had been placed in jeopardy from bands of hostile Yaqui Indians. Ambassador Clayton, who has been in Mexico for some time, communicated with and today he telegraphed from the City of Mexico that the Mexican minister for foreign affairs had informed him that orders had been immediately dispatched to the nearest body of troops to send protection to the mines.

The cause for President McDonald's resignation is not given, but it is supposed he is not strictly in accord with the proposed policy of the organization, which has in view a renewal of the rivalry with the American Federation of Labor.

PASSENGERS REBELLED.

Refused to Continue Voyage Because of Shortage of Food.

Horta, Azores, March 18.—The French transatlantic steamer Montreal, bound for New York, has returned to Horta, owing to the refusal of the passengers to continue on the voyage, the vessel being short of provisions. Serious trouble occurred between the passengers and the officers.

New York, March 18.—Details of the conflict between passengers and ship's officers aboard the French steamer Montreal at Horta, Azores, have been called by the Herald's correspondent at that port, who says that the vessel put back when 600 miles out. She was short of coal and provisions and the passengers refused absolutely to proceed. Owing to the failure to send the passengers by a faster steamship all united in a revolt and it was necessary to use armed force.

A Portuguese gunboat was called on for aid. The passengers threatened the officers and the crew with summary vengeance should they attempt to leave Horta in a revolt and it was necessary to use armed force.

To Investigate Stossel.

St. Petersburg, March 17.—A committee has been appointed under the presidency of Gen. Roop, a member of the council of the empire, to investigate the surrender of Port Arthur and act as a court to determine the responsibility of Gen. Stossel.

Russia's Financial Condition.

St. Petersburg, March 17.—According to an official statement the gold reserves in the state bank today total \$18,000,000 and the government held abroad \$25,000,000. The total amount of credit notes issued is \$185,000,000, which, according to law, should be covered by

\$31,500,000 of bullion on deposit in the state bank. This statement is interesting in connection with the government's financial position.

THE MOTHERS' CONGRESS DENOUNCES "MORMONS."

Washington, March 17.—The National Woman's congress today adopted resolutions strongly denouncing "Mormonism" and demanding the expulsion of Reed Smoot from the senate.

The National Congress of Mothers, which has been in session for a week, adjourned today to meet in March, 1906, at Los Angeles.

At a meeting of the board of managers today, Judge Lindsey of Denver was appointed chairman of the committee on juvenile court and probation. It was decided to call on every congress of mothers and every mothers' club in America to take up the fight against "Mormonism."

After reviewing the testimony given before the senate investigating committee by the superintendent of public education in Utah and saying that but four lives stand between Senator Smoot and the presidency of the "Mormon" hierarchy, the resolutions ask the United States senate to remove Reed Smoot and take such measures as will effectively prevent any organization from "defying civil and divine laws."

The resolutions commend the United States senate for its action in refusing statehood to New Mexico and Arizona. The thanks of the congress are extended to former Senator Frank J. Cannon of Utah for "the valuable service he has rendered to the nation."

"Though expelled by the Mormon hierarchy, he is welcomed in the ranks of loyal, law-abiding citizens as a brave defender of home and purity," they say.

Dr. H. W. Wiley, chief of the bureau of chemistry of the agricultural department, in an address, declared that people generally are far too easily influenced by the talk of danger in bacteria and microbes, and said that in our great efforts to sterilize the food we are making digestion impossible. He spoke of cow's milk as next to mother's milk, the best food for children, but said that when pure it should not be sterilized or pasteurized.

Mrs. Ellen Spencer Mussey of Washington advocated uniform legislation for child protection.

Gen. J. R. Hawley Dead.

Washington, March 18.—Gen. Joseph R. Hawley, for nearly 24 years United States senator from Connecticut, died this morning, aged 78 years. Death came peacefully after a stupor lasting since Wednesday afternoon. At his bedside when the end came were Mrs. Hawley, her three daughters and Maj. Hooks, for a long time messenger to the committee on military affairs of the senate.

The body will be taken to Hartford for burial, but the time for funeral services has not been fixed.

MANCHURIA.

Considered to be Virtually in State of Japanese Occupation.

New York, March 18.—The Japanese press considers that Manchuria is now, says a Times dispatch from Tokyo, virtually in a state of Japanese occupation, but the papers dismiss the thoughts of speedy peace in view of the Russian reluctance to admit defeat. Under the circumstances therefore, it is held that it will be essential to prosecute the war vigorously.

The premier, speaking Friday night at a dinner of the Bankers' club, asked his hearers to conceive themselves in the position of Russia, who, although enormously superior in resources, population, and military power, is now confronted with this painful question of suing for peace with a nation hitherto regarded with contempt. It would be unwise, he said, to anticipate such a concession. The Japanese, he added, must be prepared to continue the war to the bitter end.

PEASANTS AT THE CZARS' TOMES

The cut is from a sketch made in the crypt of the Church of St. Peter and St. Paul at St. Petersburg. This is the final resting place of the sovereigns of Russia, and it contains the bodies of all of the czars since Peter the Great.

The picture illustrates the veneration which is felt by the Russian peasant for the sacred person of the little czar. There is no more devoted subject in the world than the mouth of European Russia. He is a firm believer in the divine right of kings.

The picture represents the humble funeral procession of a victim of a charge made by the Russian soldier during the recent industrial disturbances. It is such a common occurrence

Many of the men who have fallen in the frequent clashes between the mob and the military were not allied with the strikers, but were simply bystanders who had halted to look upon the impending riot. In their brutal charge the Russian troops showed no discrimination, but fired volley after volley into the terrified crowd.
