

El Mahdi's lieutenant, commanding the rebels between Shendi ans Berber, has sent Ulemas to Berber and the villages in its vicinity, and to the districts between Shendi and Khartoum, demanding immediate submission to "our Lord, the long-expected one."

It is reported that the rebels have now captured Berber, and it is uncertain whether or not the garrison and inhabitants have been massacred.

The Khedive and his Ministers are deeply affected by the reports.






