The Presidential Party.

CONCORD, 22.—As the train with the presidential party, including Vice-President Wheeler, was heartily greeted as it came in from Concord, the President acknowledged the salute with uncovered head. Mayor Pillsbury tendered a welcome to the company, who were furnished carriages and rode through streets handsomely decorated and crowded with people.

After dinner at the hotel, the visitors held a reception in the rooms of the State House, where some 5,000 persons shook hands with the President, who subsequently, after being introduced by Governor Prescott, returned thanks to the people of New Hampshire for the cordiality of their conduct towards him.

RICHMOND, Ind., 22, 10 p.m.—Senator Morton has arrived safely, and is in good health, and is expected to be in the right side, caused by imprudence in eating, and at 4 o'clock today his condition was considered critical. Two hours later he rallied, and up to this hour is resting comfortably. Doctors Woodburn and Thompson had a consultation at 10 o'clock, to-night, and decided that there was no immediate danger, and that there was good reason for hope.

Wool Market.

BOSTON, 22.—The wool market is quiet, no sales of any importance, manufacturers having stocked up, are disposed to hold off. Medium and fine wools are in demand at 45 to 47. New Hampshire 40 to 42. Comb and Delaine fleeces are in demand at 50 to 55, the latter being the outside price for the most desirable lots. California fleeces are in demand at 38 for common and choice spring; pulled wool is scarce and quiet at 35 to 45 for super and X.
