

EDITORIAL NOTES

We direct attention to the Appropriation Act published in this issue of the NEWS. It is in itself a sufficient refutation of the falsehoods circulated by malicious and contumacious individuals as to certain items alleged to have been "amalgamated" into the bill.

Ninety-five per cent. of the graduates of the normal school of Massachusetts are employed as teachers in the public schools of that State, the largest proportion in the same connection in any State of the Union.

Following is a method adopted by some successful gardeners to obtain early tomatoes: Start about 1st to 10th of March in hot-bed; transplant when about three inches high to another bed, first cutting out the tap-root.

When about six inches high transplant to four inches apart, and when ten inches high rip on the top and transplant to ten or twelve inches apart. Leave until safe from frost and take to the field, which should have been plowed about as early in the spring as peas can be planted.

Be it enacted by the Governor and Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Utah, That section two of "An act amending the Charter of Incorporated Cities," approved February 20, 1878.

To the Recorder of Marks and Brands for the purpose of printing marks and brands for the next two years, \$175.00.

To the Territorial Superintendent of District Schools, salary for 1880 and 1881 at \$1,500 per annum, \$3,000.
