Norfolk, Va., Oct. 25 .- The informa-Norfolk, Va., Oct. 25.—The informa-tion by the government for the forfeit-ure of 8,550,000 clgarettes owned by the British-American Tobacco com-pany, limited, scizéd by the collector of customs at this port in two lots Oct. 15 and 21 because of alleged violation of the Sherman anti-trust law, was filed in the federal court this after-moon. It charges that the company "was created as an instrumentality for the especial purpose of defeating and violating the laws of the United States and carrying into effect the said unlaw-ful contracts, agreements, combinations and conspiracies with the several American tobacco concerns."
