PRO-JAPANESE KOREANS MURDERED BY INSURGENTS

MURDERED BY INSURGENTS Victoria, B. C., June 2.-News was brought by the Empress of China from Korea that nearly a thousand pro-Japanese Koreans, members of the H Chin Hoi, a society favoring Japan, have been murdered by Korean insurg-ents, according to statistics collected by Japanese officials. The Korean cabi-net, at the direction of Japan, has transferred the Korean private imperi-al estates to the national assets, cover-ing the general situation in Korea since the disbandment of the Korean army. A notable article appears in the Koku-minia, an influential semi-official or-gan of Tokio, dealing with foreign eri-ticisms of Japan. The Kokuminia calls upon the Japanese people to guard against losing the world's good opin-lon and says that instead of the uni-versal respect and good will entertained to has nearly lost the sympathy of the entire world. This attitude is con-sidered mainly to be owing to the Japanese government's over-anxiety to enlarge the army and navy beyond the innancial capacity of the nation. Com-menting on the article, the Japan Times, published by Japanese in Eng-lish, says: "Calim reflection shows that the way

Times, published by Japanese in Eng-lish, says: "Calm reflection shows that the way in which the late war resulted has been misapplied in many respects both by those in power and by the public in general." The Journal calls upon the Japanese people not to display "a swollen head."
