

## CHINESE BOYCOTT PROVES BOOMERANG

Canton Merchants Now Are Trying to Re-establish Conditions That Formerly Obtained.

IT IS CUTTING BOTH WAYS.

Has Cost Japanese Immense Sums of Money and Put Many Chinese Merchants Out of Business.

San Francisco, July 15.—The Chinese boycott, according to passengers who arrived here yesterday on the liner Korea, although costing Japan an immense sum of money, has turned out to be something of a boomerang and when the Korea left the far east the Canton merchants were trying to re-establish old conditions. The plans for the boycott were carefully laid and its effect was immediate in reducing the volume of Japanese exports into China. It was not until after the machinery had been set in motion that the commercial community of Canton discovered that in saving China's face they were emptying their own pockets.

The boycott has cost the Japanese steamship lines an immense sum, but apart from this it has only served to put numerous Chinese merchants in Japan out of business and wipe out the dividends of many commercial houses in Canton. The Canton merchants are now trying to make a peaceful compromise.

L. A. Bergholz, United States consul-general at Canton, was a passenger on the liner, but would not discuss the boycott. He said that the Chinese government is trying to encourage the use of the Pekinese dialect, the official language of China, throughout the country. As it is now a different language is spoken in each of the 15 provinces. The adoption of a common language, he says, would do away with the necessity of maintaining an army of interpreters and would bring the whole country together as would nothing else.

FREDERIC L. O. ROHRIG DEAD.

Pasadena, Cal., July 15.—Frederick Louis Otto Rohrig, A.M., Ph.D., M.D., a noted orientalist, philologist, educator and composer, died here last night, aged 58 years. He was a graduate of Halle college, Leipzig, and was at one time ambassador from Prussia to Constantinople and a lecturer in Cornell and Stanford universities.

## TRANSATLANTIC RUSH OF TRAVEL CONTINUES

New York, July 15.—The rush of Atlantic travel eastward still continues to be almost up to the average of other years. Steamship agents assert that the season was later than usual this year but that it has made amends for the falling off in the earlier sailings, and promises to continue later than usual. The three liners leaving today with full cabins for Europe are the last to sail on the high summer schedule, as the winter routes eastward go into effect tomorrow.

The minimum fare is the same all the year around, but the rates for the best cabins are practically cut in half. For instance, a deck cabin on the Lusitania, sailing today that cost \$600 for one passenger, will be only \$300 on the Mauretania, sailing July 22.

## SPEYER TAKES CHEERFUL VIEW OF THE FUTURE

New York, July 15.—James Speyer, who sails today on the Adriatic on his annual European trip, has this to say about the business outlook:

"Everybody knows that the financial and business situation has improved during the last few months, and I believe that it will continue to improve as confidence, which has been severely shaken when the number of causes continues to be restored more and more. Judging from the past, the election of Mr. Taft seems a reasonable certainty. The political situation, therefore, ought not to be too much of a disturbing factor, the more so, as the ill-considered attacks on capital generally do not find the same favor with the people as they did a little while ago. The crop prospects are also fair, and the easier money and credit situation should have a favorable influence on the revival of business generally. Some important matters, especially in relation to the railroads, remain to be adjusted but I look forward to a gradual and steady return to normal business activities, and, barring unforeseen events, I expect to find when I come home, two or three months hence, that there will be less idle cars, and less unemployed men in Wall street and elsewhere in the country."

Mr. and Mrs. Speyer expect to return to New York in October.

## SPIRITUALIST'S WILL HELD INVALID

Michigan Supreme Court Upholds Jury's Decision That a Spiritualist is Incompetent.

TESTATOR WAS INFLUENCED.

Members of Cult Made Him Believe His Son Was Not His Legitimate Heir, and They Inherited.

Chicago, July 15.—A dispatch to the Inter-Ocean from Cassopolis, Mich., says: That a spiritualist is mentally incompetent, is the holding of the supreme court in a decision rendered yesterday upholding the verdict of a Cass county jury which decided that John F. Goff was unbalanced mentally on the subject of spiritualism and therefore, incompetent when he made his will disinheriting his only son, Leslie, in favor of spiritualist associations. Goff's estate is valued at \$75,000. Mrs. Goff died when the son Leslie was born. The son is now more than 60 years of age. He has been a resident of Oklahoma for a number of years and is a well-to-do business man of that state.

It was alleged that the old man was influenced by the members of the spiritualist cult to such an extent that he was not in fact his legitimate heir and it is upon this supposition that the old man is believed to have acted when he made a will in favor of the association of spiritualists and disinherited his son.

The estate was to have been used in the advancement of spiritualism throughout the world. When the son announced that he would make a fight for the money left by his father, the National Association of Spiritualists employed lawyers and defended the action.

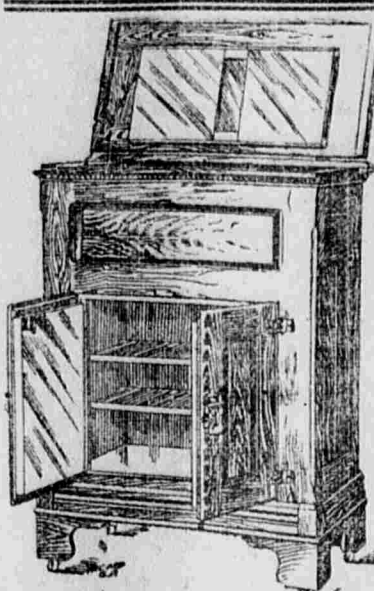

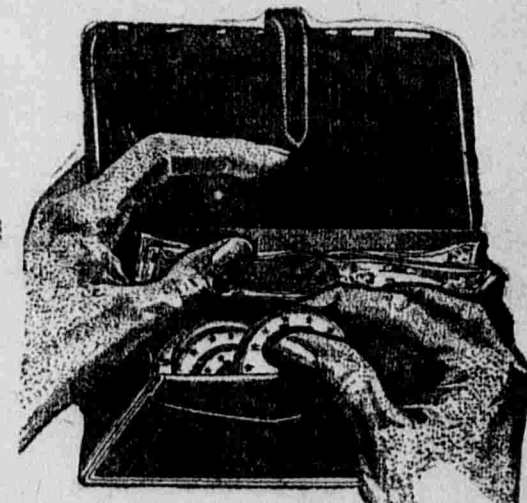
