## LOCAL AND OTHER MATTERS.

**THEATRE**—There was a liberal attendance at the Theatre on Saturday evening, and the various members of the American troupe exerted themselves to entertain the audience. To this statement we must except Miss Stevenson, who played but "did not sing at all," in consequence, as was stated, of a severe cold.

This evening the local company will present Buckston's three act drama of "A Dream at Sea," followed by the farce of "The House Dog," Miss Adams and Mrs. A. Clawson and Messrs. Margolis, Graham, Thorne, Dudley, Marden and Dunne will appear.

Mr. J. M. Hardie, who was recently called suddenly to this city from San Francisco on account of the illness of his mother, has been engaged by the management of the Theatre for one night only. He will accordingly appear to-morrow night in the character of Hamlet.

Mr. H. commenced the profession of the drama in this city, but has been performing in various parts of the country for over two years, during which time he doubtless has, by extended experience, attained to a high point of excellence as an actor. His report speaks favorably of his professional attainments. The Theatre-going public will have an opportunity of judging to-morrow night of the advancement he has made.

**THE BOOK OF MORMON**—President Geo. A. Smith kindly furnishes us the following item of interest—

"Through the courtesy of Henry B. Nottingham, of Cleveland, Ohio, I learn that Egbert B. Grandin, who printed the first edition of the Book of Mormon, died April 15th, 1912, and was buried in Palmyra, Wayne county, New York, where a stone with suitable inscription marks the spot. Major John H. Gilbert and General A. S. Sanford, who worked on the book, are alive and well, and the former residing in Palmyra, N. Y., the latter at Cleveland, Ohio. As 'Mormon' tourists frequently visit Palmyra, it may not be amiss to direct their attention to the grave of Mr. Grandin, in the cemetery of that place, as one of the particulars of interest connected with the Book of Mormon.

"I am anxious to exchange some good new Books of Mormon, last edition, for a few of the first edition, book for book."

**SNOW STORM**—The storm which commenced on Saturday evening continued until six to eight inches of snow lay on the ground on Sunday morning, much of which, however, had disappeared before night, making slush and mud plentiful, same to-day, but drying up a little.

**ACCIDENT**—On Saturday last, about noon, a son of Mr. Vanhatten, a farmer, residing in West Jordan Ward, some ten miles distance from this city, in trying to jump into a conveyance near his residence, missed his footing and fell. One of the wheels passed over and fractured his right thigh. Dr. Higgins was called in and the little patient is doing well.

**RUNAWAY**—This afternoon a mule team, with wagon loaded with baled hay, attached to a light horse, came rushing down the street, turning down East Temple Street. When a short distance east of Mayor Wells' residence, one of the men jumped from the top of the load, landing in a pool of water. The wheel grazed his head, injuring him severely. The team, taking a short cut in turning south, ran against a corner post and tore it out of the ground. The force of coming in collision with the post broke the rear pole of the wagon, thus detaching the hind part of the running gear and a number of bales of hay and throwing the other man, Isaac Hinn, we believe, violently upon the ground. The team with the front part of the wagon, kept on its way until opposite Z. C. M. I. grocery department, when it was brought to a stop by some of the employees of that establishment.

**THE IRON WORKS**—The following is an extract from a letter from Brother David B. Adams, written at Iron City, Iron Co., April 23rd:

"The furnace at Iron City is in full blast, and has been turning out as good a quality of iron as can be made in any country, during the past week. The fire brick and rock are of the best quality. There is a great demand for pig-iron as well as castings. The iron company have laid the foundation for a very large furnace. A branch of the church has been organized here, over which your humble servant has been appointed to preside."

**COAL**—"In case the territorial legislature shall fail to make provision for the payment of the fees and compensations for this act made chargeable upon the territorial treasury, then in such case, the same shall be paid out of the funds which have been or shall be appropriated by Congress to defray the expenses of the territorial legislature, and for the compensation of the members thereof."

The above is the closing provision of the Voorhees and Merriam bill. A most remarkable instrument and worthy of its judicial missionary author. There is clear evidence in it that its originator and framer is not entirely sane, or he thinks the gentlemen composing the Congress of the United States must be afflicted with mental derangement, or troubled with an exceeding looseness of ideas with regard to honesty and consistency, for were it otherwise he would never request them to legalize the taking of pay belonging to one body of men and give it to another class. If such a bill is not a downright insult to the government, we do not know what would be. Only think of it, to ask Congress to make a law to misappropriate its own appropriations. This would indeed be "small potatoes," and the suggestion is worthy the source whence it emanated. It is very suggestive as to some of the prevailing motives of those who busy themselves in shaping and manipulating the special legislation intended to the "Mormon" people, that they generally inculcate provisions which would enable them to make a direct dive at "Mormon" finances. This getting up of bills for the purpose of legalizing the pilfering of other people's pay will not work. The same is a little too low to be successful. What will the schemers try next?
