Par-reaching Importance of the British Sudan Expedition.

WITH THE CONSENT OF EUROPE.

LONDON, March 15.—[Copyright, 1896, by the Associated Press.]—The Associated Press is able to state, in connection with the reported European question, that the British government consulted and obtained the approval of a majority of the powers before deciding upon the advance upon Dongola. This makes the new Sudan campaign of par-reaching importance in its bearing upon Great Britain's relations with the European powers.

That this disclosure by recent events of Great Britain's complete and friendly relation to the community of nations has given a shock to a feeling of nationalism in the British camp, has been markedly manifested by British statements themselves.

That England's diplomacy has been

busy with efforts to make some increase in the universally popular position of Great Britain understood.

When the terms of the settlement of the dispute over the boundaries between the possessions of the United Kingdom and India were ratified, and many young men were carried off to the Spanish camp, where they were beaten over, right, the anti-war committee issued the next day a statement of protest, protesting against the changes made in Europe.
