DISTRICT COURT BUSINESS

Divorce and Other Cases Heard by Judge Rolapp Saturday.

Primary Excursion to Saltair on June 27.—Missionary Departure—Wedding.

In the case of Andrew L. Anderson against his wife, Judge Rolapp handed down his decision, granting a decree of divorce to the plaintiff, who is over 70 years of age and was married only about a month, and the question submitted on briefs, in which the husband prayed that the deed to the home, situated on Seventeenth street, which he deeded to his wife on her promising to be his wife and love and obey him, be set aside. The court held that she had not lived up to her promises, and therefore set the deed aside, but allowed her \$15 attorney's fees and half of the household goods.

The case of Larsen vs. Kristensen was ordered dismissed.

The hearing on the motion for a new trial in the case of Goddard vs. the Ogden Woolen mills was set for June 27th.

In the matter of the assignment of G. R. Behnke, the court ordered that further proceedings in the district court be stayed, and the case was transferred to the Federal court.

PRIMARY EXCURSION.

A grand primary excursion to Saltair has been arranged for Thursday, June 27, in which Weber, Box Elder, Salt Lake, Utah, Wasatch, Tooele, Granite, Jordan, Alpine and Nevada counties participate.
