Mr. S. A. Mann, Chairman of Committee on Mineral Resources, to whom was referred House Bill, No. 49, "An act to create the office of Territorial Geologist, and define the duties of said office," respectfully report that the bill was introduced and came into their hands at so late a date in the session that they are of opinion that there is not sufficient time, consistent with efficient business, to consider the same, and would therefore recommend that the same be laid over with the unfinished business, and that the same be considered at an early date at the next meeting of the Legislature.

On motion of Mr. Taylor the report of the committee was adopted.

Mr. W. W. Cluff, Chairman of Committee on Unfinished Business, to whom was referred the motion of Mr. Richards, in relation to a joint resolution, approved Feb. 16, 1872, pertaining to certain delinquent taxes, reported having taken the subject matter into consideration, and recommended that said motion be laid on the table as the object of the motion is covered by (H. F. 55). [Report accepted.]

(C. F. 29), a bill for "An act to amend an Act providing for the incorporation of railroad companies, and the management of the officers thereof," was further amended and passed.

A message was received from his Excellency, the Governor, assigning reasons for vetoing the bill entitled "An Act incorporating the City of Nephi."

Mr. W. R. Smith moved that the Territorial Road Commissioner be instructed to locate a Territorial road through Davis county, commencing at the Hot Spring, north of this city, thence north to intersect with the Territorial road in Weber county.

The subject matter was referred to the Committee on Roads, Bridges and Ferries.
