DEMONSTRATION AT TANGIER.

LITTLEFIELD PILOTAGE BILL DEFEATED IN HOUSE.

Washington, Dec. 6.—The Littlefield pilotage bill, relative to discriminating against the American sailing vessels in the coasting trade, was defeated in the House today, 139 to 164. Mr. Humphrey of Washington supported the bill. Mr. Mann of Illinois asked whether the bill was not selfish to a degree, and Mr. Humphrey replied it was selfish in favor of American vessels, and that the middle-west seemed to want no legislation except that which affected the corn fields.

DAIRYMEN FINED.

One Hundred Are Found Guilty of Selling Filthy, Diseased Milk. Louisville, Ky., Dec. 6.—Counsel representing 100 dairymen against whom charges were brought under the pure food law of feeding swill to cattle, pleaded guilty for his clients and accepted a suspended sentence of 100 days and a jail sentence of 50 days against each defendant.
