There is nothing in the statutes of Idaho which warrants the high-handed course of these Registrars and is threatened by Judges of Election. The only cause mentioned in the election laws for rejection of registration is the refusal of the applicant to "answer all questions, give all information under his control, take all oaths, and do all other acts and things required of him by law. But Standrod made out a list of questions not required by law and some of the applicants declined to answer those irrelevant queries; others answered all and yet were rejected. The only remedy for this appears to be a mandamus to compel the registrar to place the names on the proper list. But the time was too short for this remedy and the issue doubtful, because Judge Berry, whose bias has been shown in the test oath decision would have to pass upon the matter. The law provides for registration on election day by the judges of election in certain cases, but where these offi cials are under the same thumb and subject to the same dictation as the
