A view of the work from the foot of South Temple street is not possible as a long fence has been built on the edge of the yards to keep teams from attempting to proceed west on South Temple street.

The yards are divided in half by another fence running north and south in the center. On the east side are the passenger tracks, on the west the freight depots and tracks.

Over on Fourth West, between Second and Fourth South streets, the Rio Grande is clearing off the site for its proposed depot and yards.

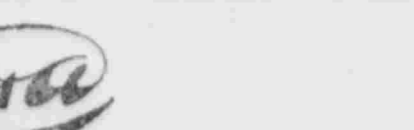
Membership of City Institution Passed 10,000 Mark. The present membership at the city library is 10,257 and over 200 teachers have been issued weekly study hours.
