

RUSSIAN ELECTORS DISFRANCHISED

Senate's Interpretation of New Election Law Disqualifies Thousands.

PURPOSE OPENLY AVOWED.

To Get Rid of Those Who Are Too Easily Swayed by Revolutionary Agitators.

St. Petersburg, Nov. 7.—The chances of the Socialists in the coming election of members to parliament were dealt a sweeping blow yesterday by the interpretation given by the senate to the new election law, which at one stroke disfranchises thousands of poorer classes. City employees, the operating personnel of the railroads and even the locomotive engineers and the most skilled and highest paid labor in Russia are affected by the interpretation. Out of the factory workers, the ranks of the Socialist party are recruited chiefly from railroad men.

This interpretation is supplementary to the senate's ruling of Oct. 26, from which it was estimated that over half a million persons who voted in the last election had been cut from the election lists. These two rulings, together with a great extent the extension of the suffrage proclaimed by Count Witte in December last year.

Their object was today frankly avowed by a member of the cabinet to be to rid the electorate of that class of voters which is too easily swayed by the influence of revolutionary agitators. This official, who is one of the few surviving ministers of the old regime, doubted whether the restrictions of the suffrage or the execution of Premier Stolypin's program of agrarian, political and religious reforms would be effective in producing a new parliament less oppositional than the first one. Continuing, this member of the cabinet expressed the conviction that it probably would be found necessary to dismiss the new parliament with a shorter shift than the first one, and make a sweeping revision in the election laws before summoning a third body.

BARELY SAVED.

Men Ready to Drop Into Ocean When They Were Rescued.

New York, Nov. 7.—Rescued when they were about ready to drop into the ocean from the deckhouse, six men, the crew of the Nova Scotia barkentine Whitehawk, and her captain were brought to this port today by the German tank steamship Manheim, which arrived from Shields. The captain is M. J. McLeod, and the mate Alexander Lascaris.

With bulwarks fast awash and her cargo of 40,000 feet of lumber littering the ocean, the barkentine was discovered drifting across the steamship track 200 miles east of Nantucket early Tuesday morning by the flare of her

She will begin her work in Philadelphia in a few days.

ATTY-GEN MOODY GOES ON SUPREME BENCH.

Washington, Nov. 7.—The president today announced the appointment of Atty-Gen. William Henry Moody of Massachusetts, as justice of the supreme court of the United States, to succeed Justice Henry Billings Brown, who retired some time ago. Mr. Moody has filled the office of attorney-general since July 1, 1904. Previous to that time he had served for more than two years as secretary of the navy. He had also represented his state in the Fifty-fourth, Fifty-fifth, Fifty-sixth and Fifty-seventh Congresses. It is generally expected that Mr. Moody will retire from the department of justice the latter part of December.

NORWEGIAN CABINET CHANGES.

Christiania, Nov. 7.—The minister of finance and customs, E. Hagerup-Bull, and the minister of agriculture, A. Reving, have resigned, and have been succeeded, respectively, by M. Berge and M. A. Arosland. These changes in the cabinet are an outcome of the recent election, which resulted favorably to the Leftists. The new ministers are prominent Democrats.

RUSSIAN TAX BILL APPROVED.

St. Petersburg, Nov. 7.—The council of ministers has approved the income tax bill of the minister of finance, M. Kolosov, which is estimated to produce revenue amounting to from \$12,500,000 to \$20,000,000.
