SENATE.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 2.—In the Senate the House joint resolution reducing by 50 per cent the duties on goods imported for exhibition at the World's Fair was passed. It releases from duty altogether articles acquired by the Columbian mission for its own use.

The Senate bill to authorize the Missouri River Power company of Montana to construct a dam across the Missouri river, was placed on the calendar. The House bill for a fire-dam at the reservoir outlet for the great lakes was passed.

Haworth introduced a bill for the free and unlimited cutting of silver, and it was referred to the Finance committee.

Gorman offered a resolution to adjourn the session at an early recess, or certain days, and it was referred to the committee on contingent expenses.

The House concurrent resolution providing for adjustment of the amount of the Senate's appropriation for the construction of the Panama Canal, was passed. The resolution, originated in Gorman, was referred to the committee on appropriations.

The House bill to increase by twenty-five per cent of military officers' pay was referred to the Adjournment Committee.

The House bill to extend the time for the execution of the Chinese extradition act was voted up, and Davis offered an amendment, requesting the vote of July 6, 1863, be substituted. The amendment was rejected.

The act of 1863 required a Chinese Peter who accused of being unlawfully in this country, to be given the option of leaving the country or being tried here.

There was no other law of the kind in this country, and it would be a source of trouble.

Ball voted in favor of the proposed amendment of the act of 1863.

White (Dem.) of California then addressed the Senate on the Chinese extradition bill.
