### WEBER COUNTY BUSINESS.

Samuel P. Draney of Plain City Falls from a Tree and Dies from Injuries.

### Return School Girls Held for Arson—Peery Mansion to be Transformed into Family Hotel.

Eva Curtis and Minerva Reeves, the two young girls charged with arson, were given their preliminary hearing before Judge Howell yesterday afternoon at 2 o'clock. The girls being without means with which to employ an attorney, appeared in court without counsel, but they were advised by the court and County Attorney Hulanicki not to go on the witness stand in their own behalf until their case should come up in the district court for trial.

The first witnesses for the prosecution were Superintendent Allison, of the State Industrial school, and his wife, who testified to the Reeves girls and another inmate of the institution named Amelia Robinson, running down the stairs from the dormitories after they had set the beds on fire, and to their confessing to the crime. Thomas Meyers, a guard at the school, corroborated the testimony of the other witnesses.

Amelia Robinson, the other girl involved in the plot, testified that the two girls charged with the crime together with herself and another girl were chosen by the other female inmates of the institution to start the fire, but that she did not have any part in it. He was taken to the hospital, but died before he could be removed.
