

SMALL POX AT FORT DOUGLAS.

Last evening the starting case of small pox had developed at Fort Douglas. The person stricken with the disease is a recruit to the ranks of the army. There had been several cases of small pox among the soldiers at the hospital and it was of great concern that Jenkins was afflicted with the disease. The physician attending him, Dr. H. H. Jones, has been notified and he is now under his care. The case has been isolated and the patient is being treated in a special ward. It is believed that the disease was contracted by Jenkins while he was in the city of Salt Lake. The children of Jenkins are being kept in a special room and are not allowed to go to school. The case is being watched closely and it is hoped that it will not spread.

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TROOPS SENT TO LAKE CITY
