REED GIRL DISAPPEARS

Leaves Home Monday and Police Fail to Locate Her—Anxious Search of Mother.

Since last Monday, Bernice E. Reed, the 11-year-old daughter of Mrs. E. Reed, a widow of 30 east Eighth South street, has been missing from her home and search made by her anxious mother and by police officers have failed utterly to get any trace of her. The strange disappearance of the girl was reported to Chief of Police Pitt last evening and since that time detectives and patrolmen and the girl's mother have searched the city in vain for her. Mrs. Reed was employed by the Mount Pickle company, Monday afternoon, when she returned home and found herself in a brown sailor suit and left her home. She did not say where she was going and when she failed to return during the evening Mrs. Reed concluded her daughter had come to the home of a friend to remain overnight, and did not feel anxious about her. When Tuesday morning dawned without any trace of the girl Mrs. Reed became alarmed. She called upon friends of her young daughter but none of them had seen her. Then the mother appealed to the police and officers were detailed on the case but not the slightest trace of her has been found.

Brings Children from Orphanage to Substantiate Claim of Neglect.

Mrs. John Kooyman, some time divorced from her notorious consort, was once more in the joint building limelight yesterday afternoon. The woman was parading through the corridors of the building, carrying a little nite of a child in her arms, leading another tottered youngster by the hand, while a third, equally dirty and tattered, was tugging at his mother's skirt. The woman had just come in from the State street orphanage, where two of her children had been placed by order of the juvenile court. She went out to the home with the purpose of seeing her children, but upon arriving there she found the children playing around in such a dirty condition that her mother's heart was touched and she brought them down to the court to show the officers how they were being cared for at the orphanage. Their clothes were dirty, the children unwashed, and uncombed, without hats and with very dirty clothing covering their little bodies. Mrs. Kooyman was permitted to retain her 4-year-old boy, Peter, and the others were returned to the orphanage.

John Kooyman, it is understood, is now in Denver, with his second wife, the former Mrs. Eagon. While the officers are rejecting that Salt Lake is the man, they are wondering how long he will remain out of the Denver courts.

LOCAL BRIEFS.

One Trainload Daily—The Independence Coal company is shipping from its mines in southern Utah a trainload of 15 cars a day.

Gymnastics and Aquatics—The Y. M. C. A. will give informal demonstration of gymnastics and swimming exercises next Wednesday evening, in the association building.

Committee to Award Contract—The building committee of the Commercial club is meeting this afternoon, to award the contract for building the foundations of the new club house, corner of Exchange Place and Cactus street.

New School for Hinkley—A. C. Nelson, state superintendent of public instruction, has gone to Hinkley, Millard county, to attend the dedication exercises of a new \$20,000 school building just completed there. The exercises occur tonight.

Delinquent Poll Taxes—The list of delinquent poll taxes is now being made up by the city tax collector. All whose poll taxes are not paid in the immediate future will be sued. Additional expense will then accrue to the original \$2 poll tax.

Athletes in the Guard—The movement in national guard circles to organize a military athletic association was continued last Monday evening, one week, by which time all members of the guard will have been communicated with on the subject.

Move for "Prosperity Week"—At yesterday afternoon's meeting of the Real Estate association, a letter was read from Edgus S. Darling of Los Angeles, suggesting the idea of Prosperity week, which is to be celebrated all over California Nov. 15-21, and the suggestion is "buy and boost home products."

Cornell Graduates to Entertain—There are over 100 graduates of Cornell university in Utah, 60 of them in Salt Lake, seven in Provo, and 10 in Logan, and the rest scattered over the state. They propose to entertain President Schurman with a banquet at the University club on his arrival here next month.

Remains Brought Here—The remains of J. B. Bushnell, who died at Carson City last Saturday, arrived in Salt Lake today, and the funeral will be held at 2 p. m. this afternoon, from Old Fellows hall, with internment in the city cemetery. The deceased was formerly a resident of Murray, where his wife died some years ago.

Boulevard Meeting—Property owners along the boulevard were to have met last night, to discuss plans for local improvement; but owing to the lack of attendance, there was a postponement for one week. The excitement consequent upon the election will then be over, and boulevard work will be more in a frame of mind to consider things seriously.

Brief for Dr. Stevenson—Dean McNiece of Westminster college, of which Dr. A. M. Stevenson is president, says he does not believe the doctor ever uttered the sentiments reflecting on the Mormon people, that are attributed to him. Dr. McNiece says he never heard Dr. Stevenson make any statement anywhere that could be construed that way, and that he has always been careful as to his utterances on home topics.

No Contracts Awarded—The city board of works held a special meeting last evening for the purpose of opening bids for the construction of the gas producing plant and engineer's residence at the pumping station, but no action was taken. Bids on sidewalk extension No. 50 were also opened, but no contracts were awarded. The regular meeting of the board will be held Friday evening. The city engineer will check up on all bids and submit a report on the same Friday evening.

Is the Latest from Scene of
Dynamite Outrage at
Montecali, Georgia.

PRESIDENT CALLIS' VIEWS

Says Work of Irresponsible Fellow
And Majority of Residents in Dis-
trict Are Kind to L.D.S. Elders.

Chattanooga, Tenn., Nov. 5, 1908. President C. A. Callis, Salt Lake City, Utah, church wrecked; no one hurt; got good clues.

The above dispatch in regard to the dynamite outrage at Montecali, Ga., as told in last night's bulletins, was received by President Callis today. President Callis will tonight leave for the headquarters of the Latter-day Saints mission and investigate the dynamite outrage.

This morning he stated that he had received to suspect a certain individual at Montecali who in the past had been declaring that he would drive them out of the country. The fellow, says Callis, is utterly irresponsible and his sentiments are not shared by the rest of the community. Just who the four Mormon elders mentioned in the dispatch are is not known here at this time. President Callis states that it is reasonably certain that one of them is Paul E. Nelson of Crescent, Salt Lake county, who presides over the Atlanta conference.

"Montecali is a small agricultural community about 20 miles from Atlanta," explained Callis. "Electric lights, porcelain bath tub, basin and toilet, clothes closet, cemented cellar, 6 feet deep, and a fine view of the city, dry ground. Only \$250; terms \$50 cash and balance same as rent."
