

BIG MONEY MADE BY HUGH MINTOSH

Receipts for Burns-Johnson Fight
Aggregate Great Sum of \$150,000.

AN OFFER FOR JEFFRIES.

Promoter Will Give \$50,000 to Get Match With Retired Champion And the Black Man.

Sydney, N. S. W., Dec. 27.—Almost the same topic of conversation here now is the Johnson-Burns fight and the probability of getting James J. Jeffries to emerge from retirement and fight the new champion for the laurels the Californian once held.

Whether it will be possible to arrange a battle to take place at Rushcutters bay between Johnson and Jeffries is not known, but certainly every effort to do so will be made by Hugh McIntosh, the fight promoter, who has notified that he will leave for the United States, by way of England, Jan. 2, and offer a purse of \$50,000 in an endeavor to entice Jeffries across the seas to meet Johnson.

That McIntosh can afford to offer an enormous purse for another championship "go" is shown by the fact that the receipts from the Johnson-Burns fight aggregated \$150,000. This amount, it is believed here, is the greatest ever taken in for a single prize fight. Of this sum, Burns received \$30,000 and Johnson \$75,000, including \$25,000 for his traveling and training expenses.

Thus far, Bill Squires, the local heavy-weight champion, who has been vanquished by Burns, is the only man who has been offered a deal to Johnson, and the big Texan has signified his willingness to meet Squires for \$10,000 a side. It is unlikely, however, in view of the impression Johnson has made, that Squires will be able to find a backer.

JOHNSON NOT HURT

Johnson is in perfect condition and shows no marks of the battle with Burns. While he has the purse for defeating the champion was small in comparison with the amount received by Burns, Johnson now is enabled to pick up a considerable sum of money on the Vaudeville stage. He has been engaged by a Sydney music hall for a term of five weeks for an act consisting of bag-punching and the methods employed by him in training. For the first time he will receive \$1,500 per week. In February Johnson will sail for London, where he expects to fight Sam Langford, the American colored heavy-weight, on Derby day, before the National Sporting club.

Burns also is in good condition, except for discolorations about the eyes and a badly swollen jaw. At first it was thought that the heavy punches had broken the white man's jaw, but it now turns out that it was only badly bruised. The French-Canadian adheres to the decision he made prior to meeting Johnson—that it would be his last fight, despite the result. He says he has made during his fighting career \$30,000, and that this is enough to keep him from want.

When McIntosh sails for London next week he will take with him the moving pictures of the Johnson-Burns fight.

JACK O'BRIEN AWAKENS FROM A LONG SLEEP

Sydney, N. S. W., Dec. 28.—Philadelphia Jack O'Brien has called Hugh McIntosh, the fight promoter, that he stands ready to fight Jack Johnson, the negro victor over Tommy Burns. He makes inquiries as to the terms and Mr. McIntosh has taken the matter under consideration.

THERE WILL BE NO FIGHT, SAYS JEFF

Los Angeles, Dec. 27.—"There will be no fight between Jack Johnson and myself," they are not talking to me," said former heavyweight champion Jas. J. Jeffries to a representative of the Associated Press in this city tonight when he was told that Hugh McIntosh, the Australian promoter, was going to offer \$50,000 for a fight between himself and the new champion.

"I don't want the money," he said, "I am out of the game, and the public might as well understand it. I fought my last fight some time ago, and I am not in the habit of receiving any money, nor any inducement anybody can hold out would get me into the ring again."

MANY BOAT RACES AT MASSACHUSETTS BAY

Boston, Dec. 27.—With several international yacht contests, two long distance power boat affairs, another ocean race to Bermuda and a number of minor events, it is likely that the interest in pleasure-boat sailing next summer will center in Massachusetts bay, while two of the German royalty, Prince Henry of Prussia and Prince Friedrich, son of Emperor William, will lend official dignity to the sport for the first time in this country. The Sonder races, which proved so successful three years ago at Marblehead and two years ago at Kiel, will be sailed in the bay, and the final choice of the three boats to represent Germany in the international contest will be made at the Kiel regatta.

CHANGE OF DATE.

Billings, Mont., Dec. 27.—The twenty-round boxing match between Eddie McFie and Tony Caponi, scheduled for January at Billings, Mont., will be pulled off at Billings about Jan. 10. This bout is perhaps the most notable new under discussion among the fight fans since the Australian match of Burns and Johnson in the heavyweight class, as the winner is to be matched against Stanley Ketchell.

"I do take the track you may rest assured that the public will get the same class of racing they had before when I was in charge," he said. "I have not signed up any riders, but there is plenty of time for that and I have a hunch of the best ones on the string."

At one time the Salt Palace saucer was practically in the down and out class and in Harry Heagren was found the man to start the game going along proper lines and he turned poor prospects into satisfactory results.

Other matters connected with the management of the track, but it rests entirely with Heagren whether or not he has charge of the famous course. He is anxious to see many needed improvements and says if he has his way there will be a new surface before the game opens up.

ATTELL WILL FIGHT.

Agrees to Meet Freddie Weeks at Goldfield Jan. 14.

In a telegram to Tex Rickard yesterday, Abe Attell, featherweight champion of the world, now at New Orleans, where he is to fight a second rounder, says that he will accept a match with Freddie Weeks, and that he will run in the country. He says that he will win today as to what route he expects to take for Goldfield, Rickard has not yet decided. In addition to \$25,000 win, lose or draw, railroad tickets to Goldfield for two.

The fight will be held at the Nevada and the west is already on the qui vive over the coming event, scheduled for the night of Jan. 14. Yesterday, practically 200 ringside tickets at \$10 each were reserved, while fully 200 more were engaged by Goldfield people at the price named. This indicates that the house will be sold out a week or so before the event is pulled off. The title of featherweight champion of the world will be at stake, and the contest promises to be one of the most interesting of the year.

The Attell-Weeks contest will be one of the biggest boosters given in the small city in the country, said Ben Rosenzweig yesterday. "My faith in Goldfield has never for a moment wavered, and I am as confident of the future as I am that I shall live until dark tonight. This will be the fight of the biggest men in their class, and Goldfield will see that the contest is red-hot from the start, the same as was the Nelson-Gans bout that the country is still talking about. Goldfield will be measured by dollars and cents, even the friends of Arthur Douglas, the champion of South Africa and Australia, are interested."

Tex Rickard announced last evening that he would probably secure the Attell-Weeks fight, and that he has a few hundred more than even the Hippodrome theater. Every available seat in the house will be sold for the fight. The demand for the former high-priced chairs shows how hungry the public is for a real live pugilistic event. Mr. Rickard will put down \$100 in gold as a license for this fight. The complimentary list will be limited to perhaps 15 or 20, altogether.

It was Rickard who promoted the Gans-Nelson go, and he said last evening that he expected this featherweight contest to equal or surpass the former in importance, both to Goldfield as a gold producer and a live camp, and to the sporting world in general. During the last fight of two years ago the Boone Post streamed across the top of the first page, these were the words: "Twenty Million Eyes on Goldfield." Details in all the New York, Chicago and Boston papers were filled with the details of the bout, and brokers round their apartments the next morning were making money with ease on the tape. Thirty thousand people choked the streets of Denver during the fight, and enthusiasm and betting were always at high pitch. In all probability, the Pacific coast will send a large delegation of pugilistic fans to Goldfield for the fight, to say nothing of great crowds from Reno, Carson, Tonopah, Elko, and other points in Nevada, and even Cripple Creek, from which last named city Freddie Weeks has been taken, where his stock is always above par.
