FINLAND.

A Frenchman, A. Rabin, has been questioned 10,000 francs to daughters whose fathers have perished in the service of the life-long guard.

Swedenborgians in America and England have submitted \$5,000 toward a Swedenborg memorial in Stockholm. The money will probably be used to aid the recently established Swedenborg church and provide a library of the numerous writings of the seer.

One hundred and fifty emigrants from Stockholm left April 19 for the Far East. A great number of people had assembled on the quay to bid them a good-bye to the distant land.

The Democratic leaders are agitating for a general strike of agricultural laborers during harvest time, so being the most efficacious means of bringing the landowners to terms.

Eleven bakery firms of Stockholm have suspended business during the last twelve months in consequence of the bakers' strike.

The export of cereals has considerably increased of late, while imports have materially decreased.

A wife killed named August Johanson, who on the 11th of March last fatally stabbed his wife, has been sentenced to seven years in the penitentiary.

A stone-blaster has calculated that he has to strike with his mallet 15,000 times to earn a pittance of 30 cents a day.

A strike of 4,000 miners in the district of Norberg has been amicably settled. The strikers have not demanded any special concessions, but they arrived too late.

On unspooling a barrel of American corn lost the body of a child was discovered inside. The freshly consigned corn was returned to the agent.

A fire that occurred at Sodderhamn, April 25, consumed a large building containing eight stores and a warehouse belonging to Nilsen Jonsson.

Ten suspicious notes of 1000 kroner each have been seized at Vorn, near Huddiksvall, and the possessor, Olof Jonsson, imprisoned. The notes had been made in America and mailed to Sweden. The accomplice, being his brother, Olof Jonsson, is on his return to Sweden, and is expected to be captured in England.

Seventeen hundred emigrants are expected to leave Stockholm in June for the Pacific to become agricultural laborers.

Colonel P. Melin has sent \$2000 to the Museum of Stockholm to procure plaster copies of antique statues.

A farmer, John Alfred Karlsson, from Skarsting, was captured on board a steamship for Hull, on his way to America, making his escape after committing a burglary on the bank of Malarstrand for \$700.

A unique collection of 942 square Swedish coins has been made by M. L. Cayrol, a druggist in Biarritz.

Another schoolhouse auction in Sweden has recently taken place in the parish of Torsbo, near Åmål. Not less than 67 persons, mostly old and decrepit, were present. One of the hammer was to be maintained each for less than \$20 a piece a year.

Seventy per cent of the youths of western Otagoland have emigrated within the last few years, yet that province is one of the very best agricultural districts in Sweden. There must be something radically wrong in the social condition of a people that comes there to depopulate the land. The upper classes in Sweden are generally cruelly envious to working people.

An emigrant, who has been nine years in America and last present paying a visit to his native home near Västana, was recently seized by the military authorities and compelled to serve as a convict. The clergyman of his parish kindly volunteered the information to the authorities.

The Swedish Consulate von Koch, of Gulland, procured thirty of her dependents with savings bank accounts, each receiving from \$20 to \$120, according to the length of time they have been in her service. This venerable lady is long acknowledged as the most loyal dame of the Swedish aristocracy. No known child.

A "Jewish brigand" has been organized by the Russian Army in Yekel, for the purpose of carrying the war into the very heart of the enemy, in the case of inquiry.

Karl Holmquist, a workman who has been employed for fifty-five years at the old ironworks factory at Yekel, has been awarded a pension by his employers for long and faithful service amounting to \$1 a year, which does not rise to \$1 a year, by way of reward.

A donor who modestly desires to remain unknown has sent \$200 to the fund for aged servants.

Several small farmers have left their homesteads in desolation, not being able to find a purchaser or leaseholder, and emigrated to America.
